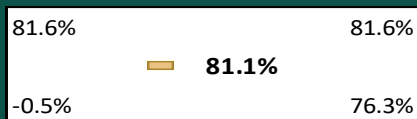

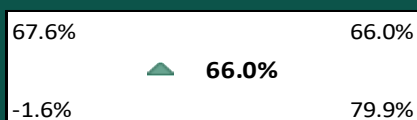

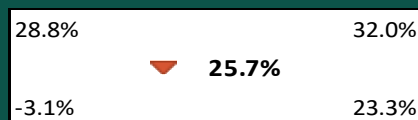

**Headcount enrollment change:**

Total headcount decreased by 209 students (-0.8%)  
Undergraduate headcount increased by 42 students (0.2%)  
Graduate level headcount decreased by 304 students (-3.8%)  
Professional level headcount increased by 53 students (2.6%)

**Credit hour enrollment change:**

Total credit hours increased by 2,833 credits (1.0%)  
Undergraduate credit hours increased by 3,979 (2.0%)  
Graduate level credit hours decreased by 2,162 (-3.8%)  
Professional level credit hours increased by 1,016 (2.5%)

First time in any college (FTIAC) undergraduate headcount increased by 65 students (2.5%)

Transfer undergraduate enrollment headcount increased by 29 students (1.5%)

Minority total enrollment headcount increased by 137 students (1.6%)

Total international enrollment headcount decreased by 433 students (-18.0%)

The full-time FTIAC (degree-seeking) one year retention (freshman returning a second year) remained about the same at 81.1% from the prior year at 81.6%.

The four-year graduation rate was 20.1% for the Fall 2013 cohort, a 1.7 percentage point increase from the prior year.

The five-year graduation rate was 37.8% for the Fall 2012 cohort, a 0.8 percentage point increase from the prior year.

The six-year graduation rate was 46.6% for the Fall 2011 cohort, a 7.5 percentage point increase from the prior year.

# Total Enrollment

## Fall Enrollment Report

2017

The Fall 2017 total enrollment headcount was 27,089; This is a slight decrease (0.8%) from the Fall 2016 count of 27,298.

**Total credit hours** increased by 2,833 or 1.0%:

**Undergraduate** students averaged 11.9 credit hours;

**Graduate** students averaged 7.3 credit hours;

**Law** students averaged 13.3 credit hours;

**Medical** students averaged 24.6 credit hours;

**Pharmacy** students averaged 13.6 credit hours;

The portion of students that are full-time has increased 2.7 percentage points in the past 5 years.

89.0% of Wayne State students were Michigan residents. 78.6% of WSU's students came from the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb county areas. Since 2006, the proportion of in-state students has remained at approximately 90%, overall.

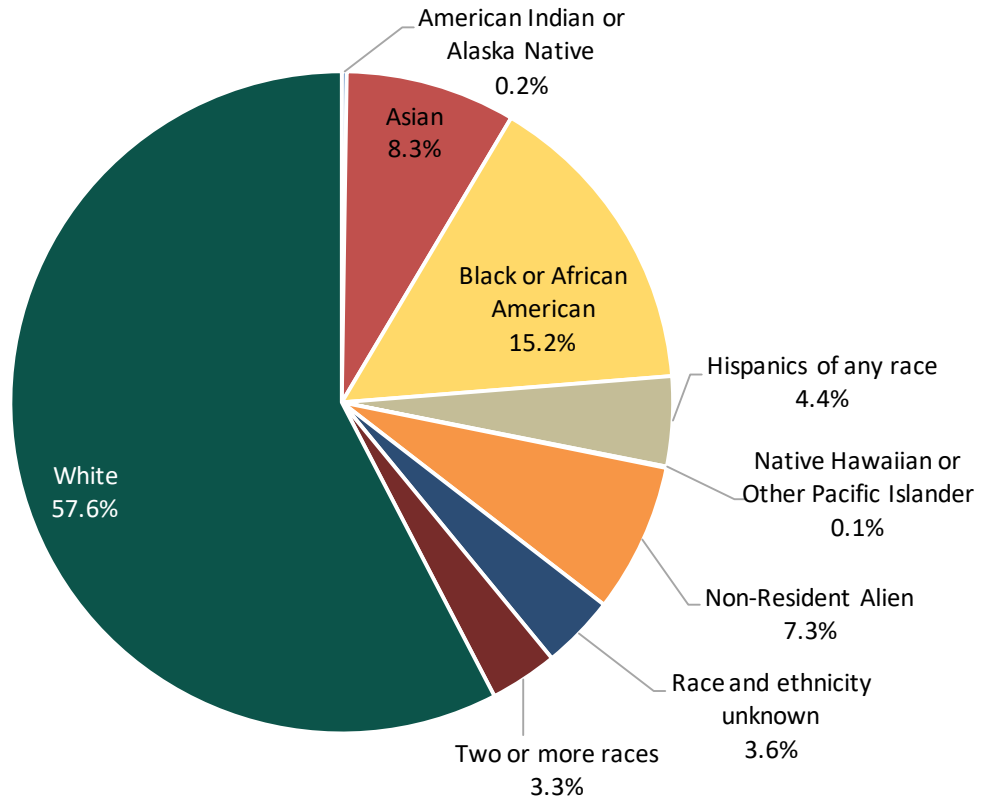

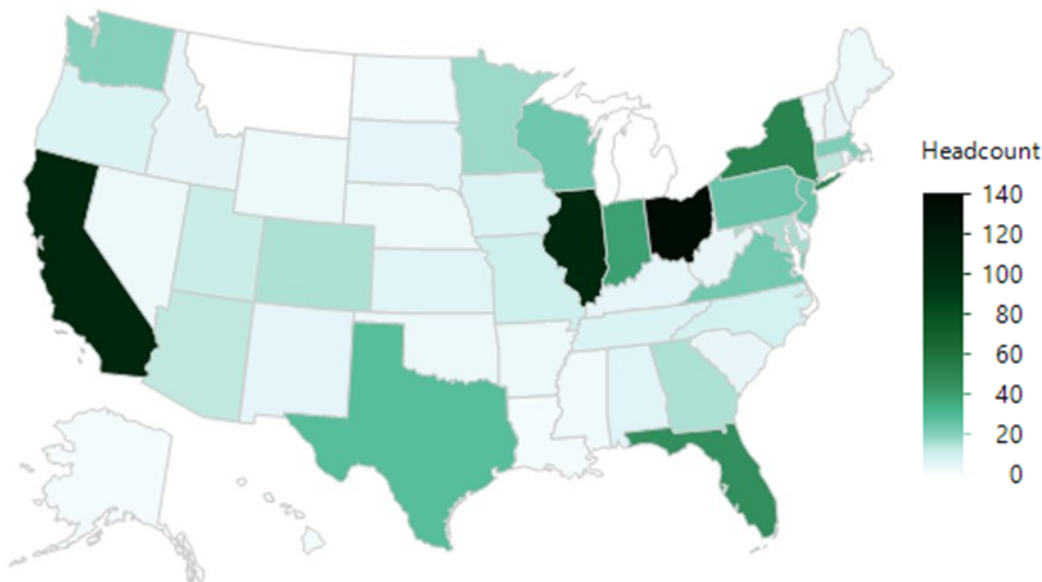
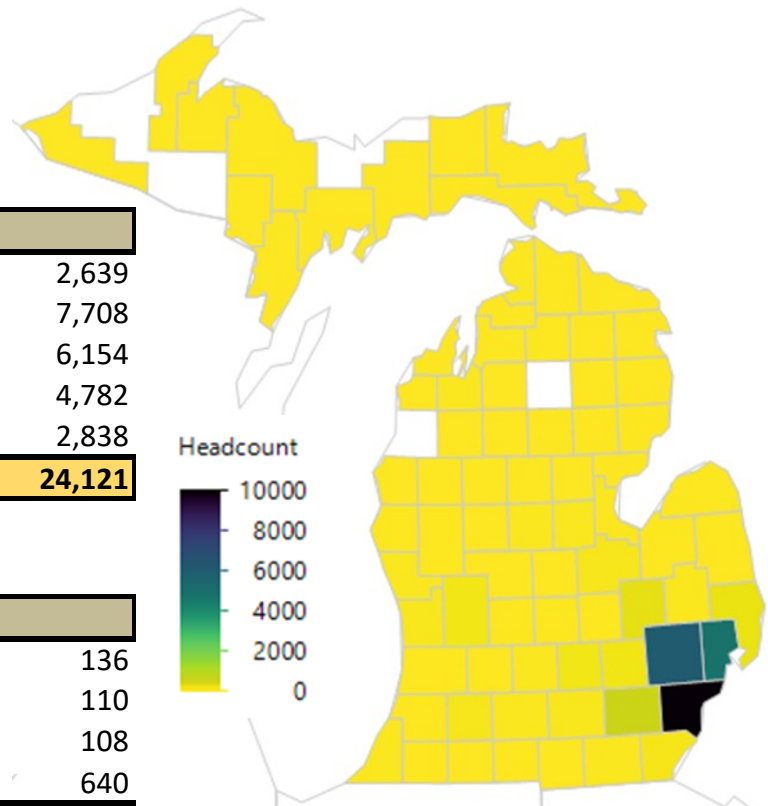
### Fall 2017 Total Enrollment by Age

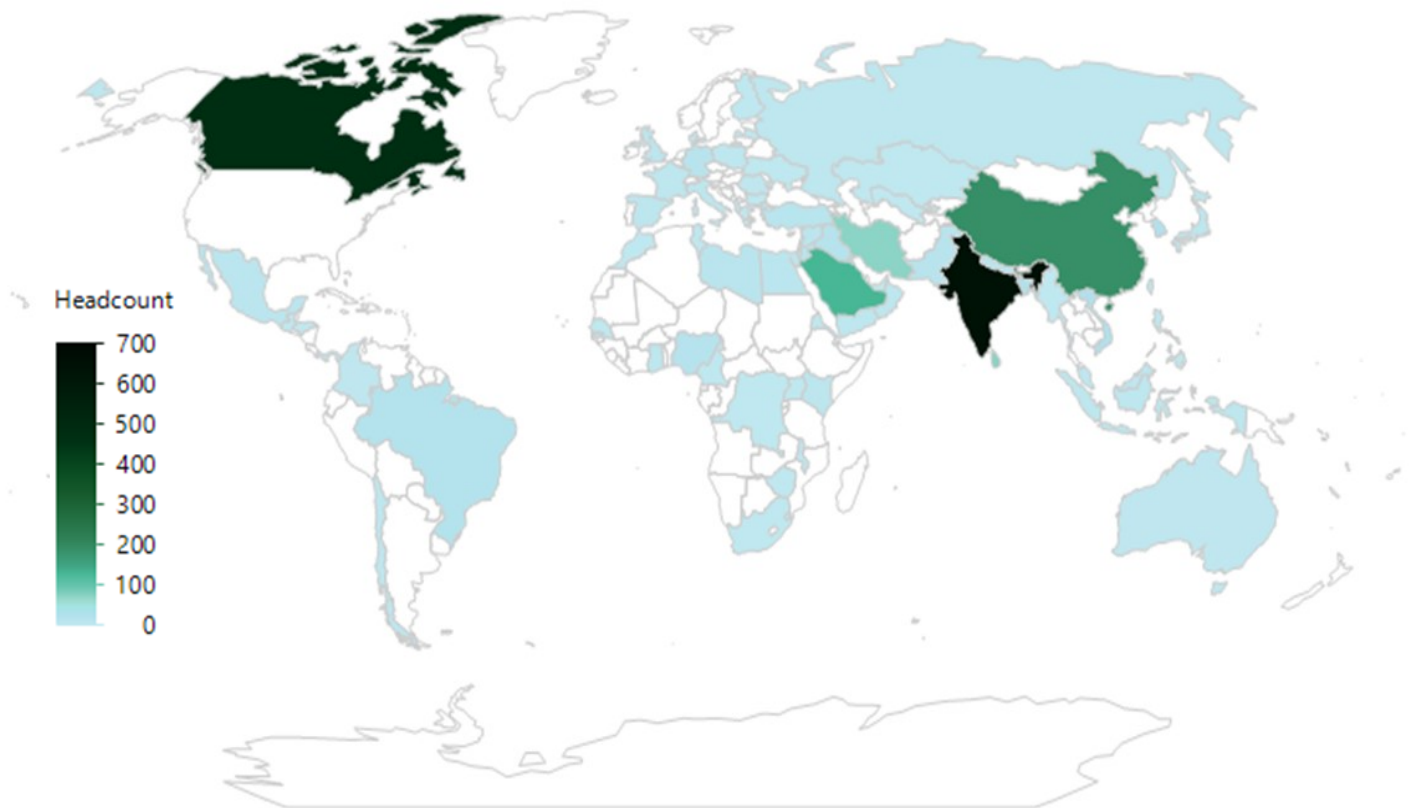

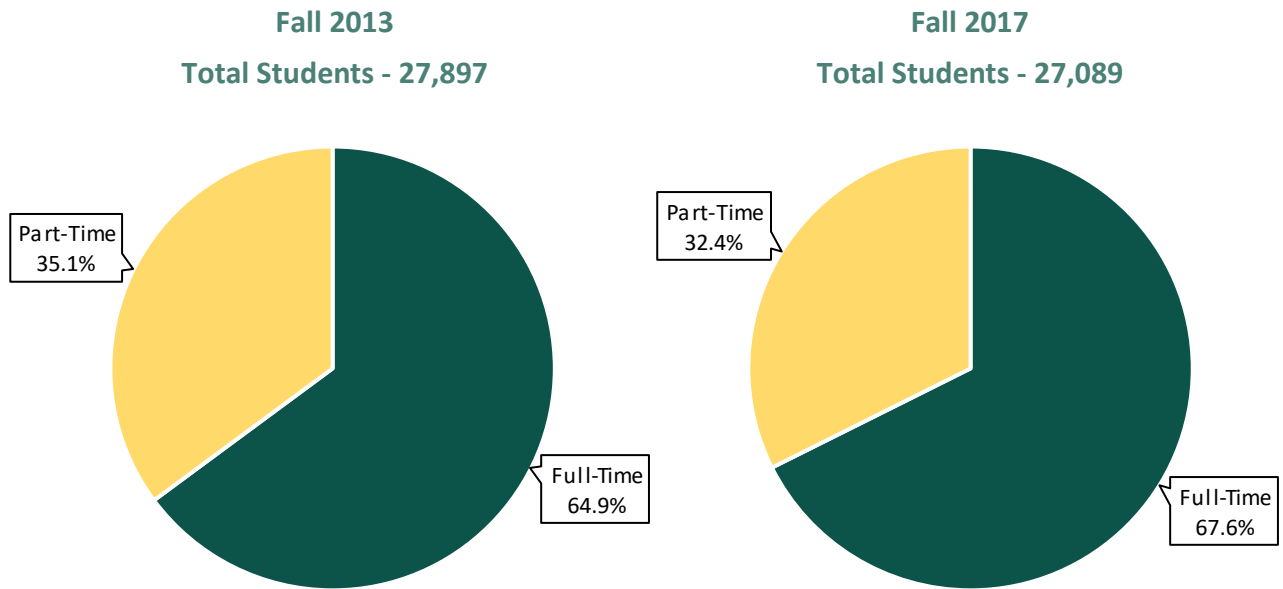


## Fall 2017 Total Enrollment by Geographic Origin

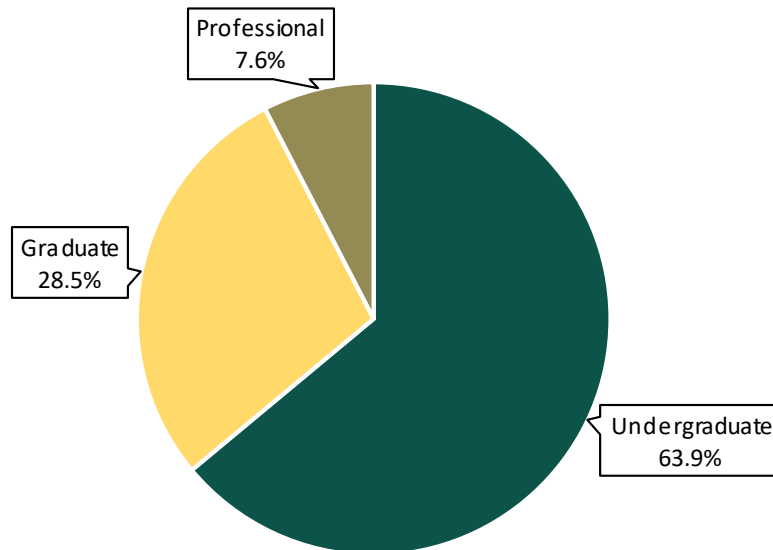

## Fall Enrollment Report 2017

The undergraduate fall enrollment headcount and credit hour totals increased since Fall 2016.

Continuing undergraduate enrollment rose 0.1%.

Both FTIAC and transfer enrollment increased.

Other new students (dual enrollment, permit to register, etc.) declined from 412 to 350, -15.0%.

The Fall 2017 average undergraduate credit hour load increased for a fourth consecutive year, from 11.7 in Fall 2016 to 11.9 in Fall 2017.

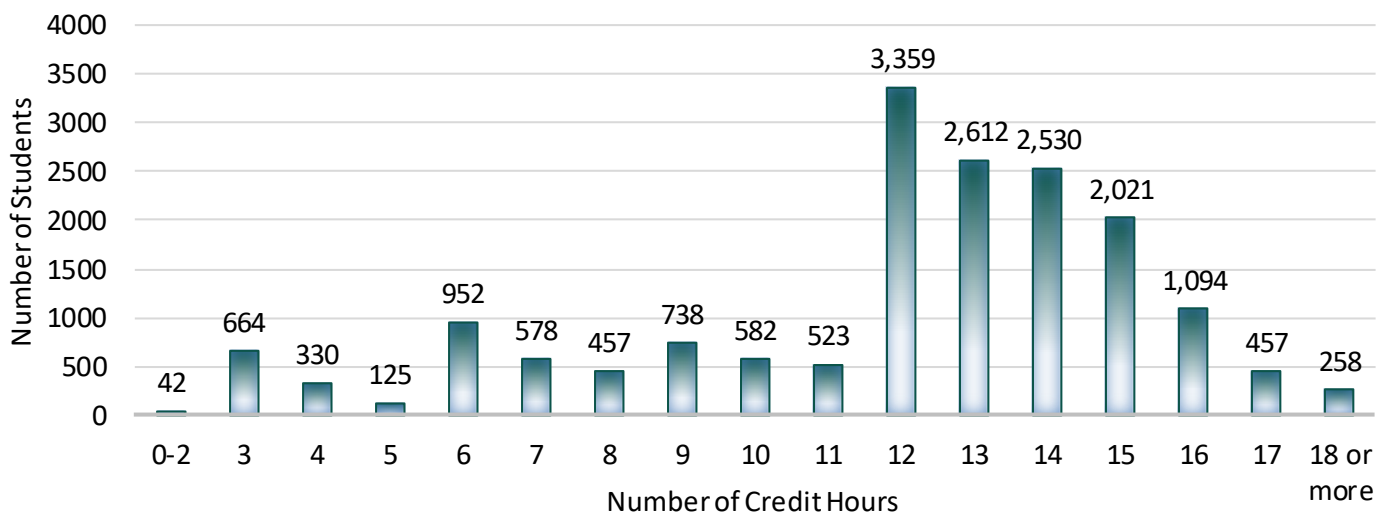

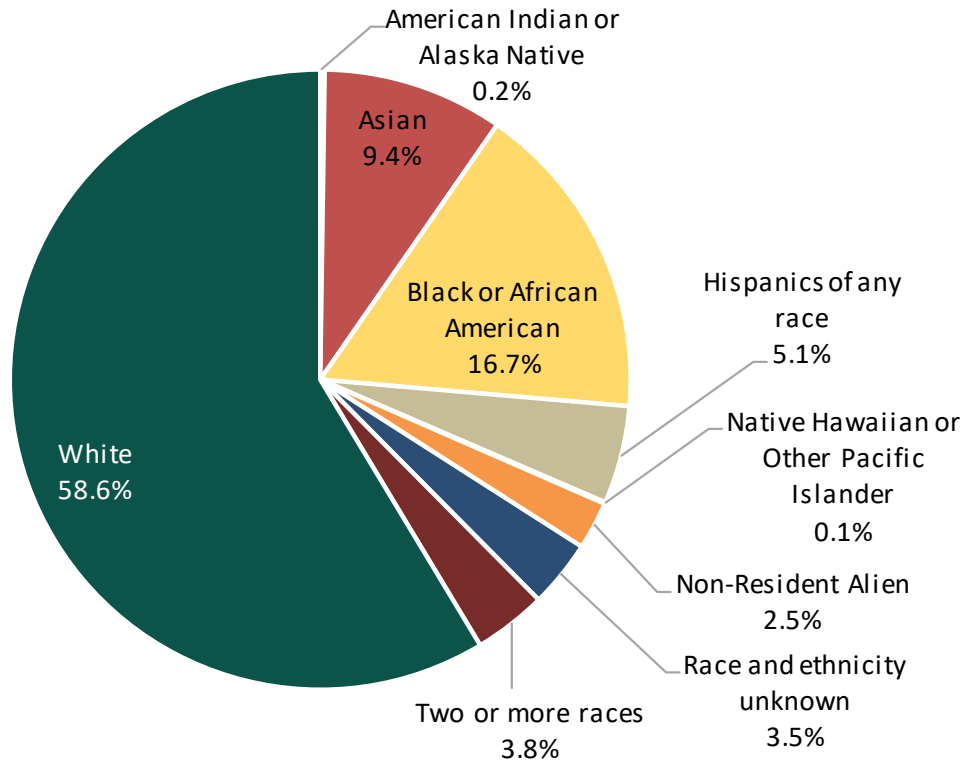

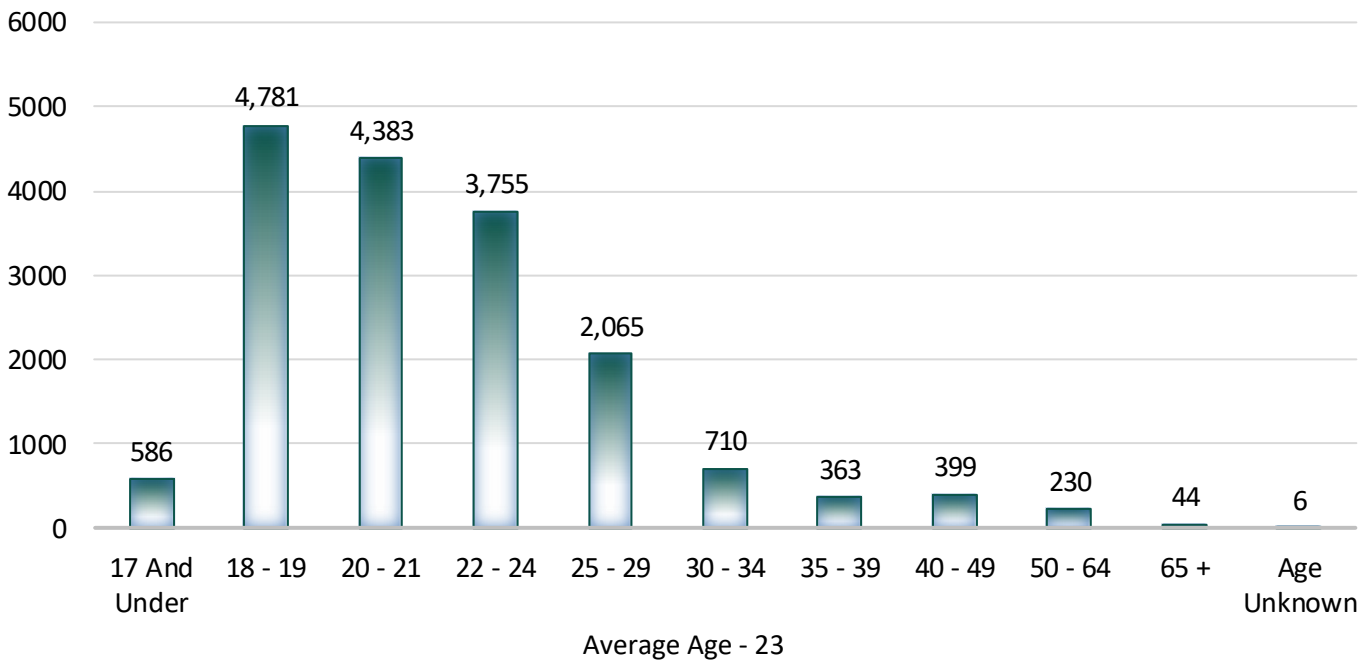
Average Student Credit Hour Load - 11.9



### Fall 2017 Undergraduate Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity



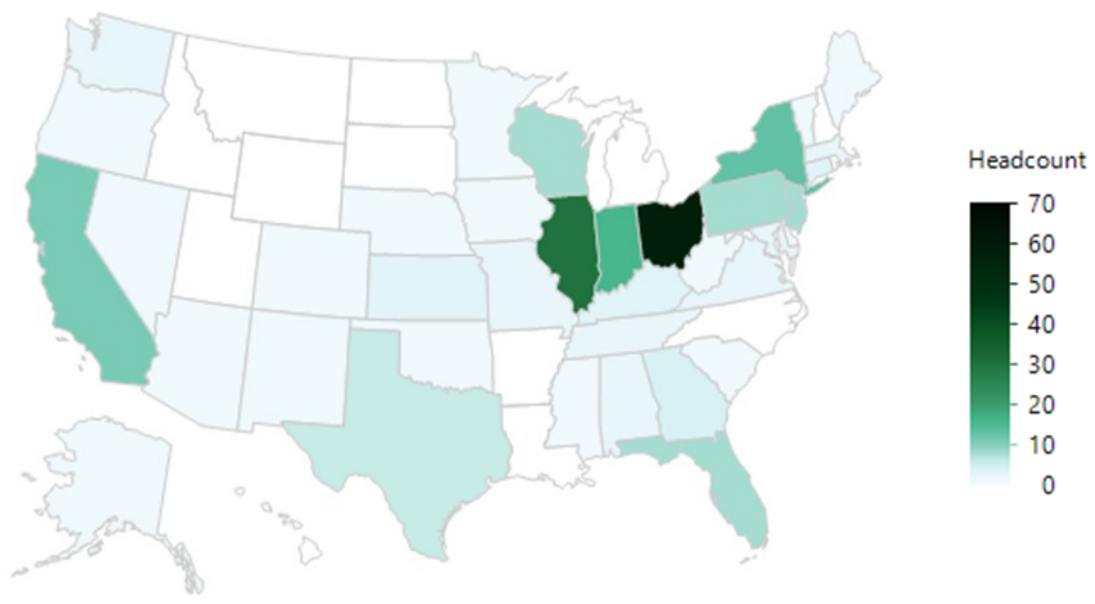
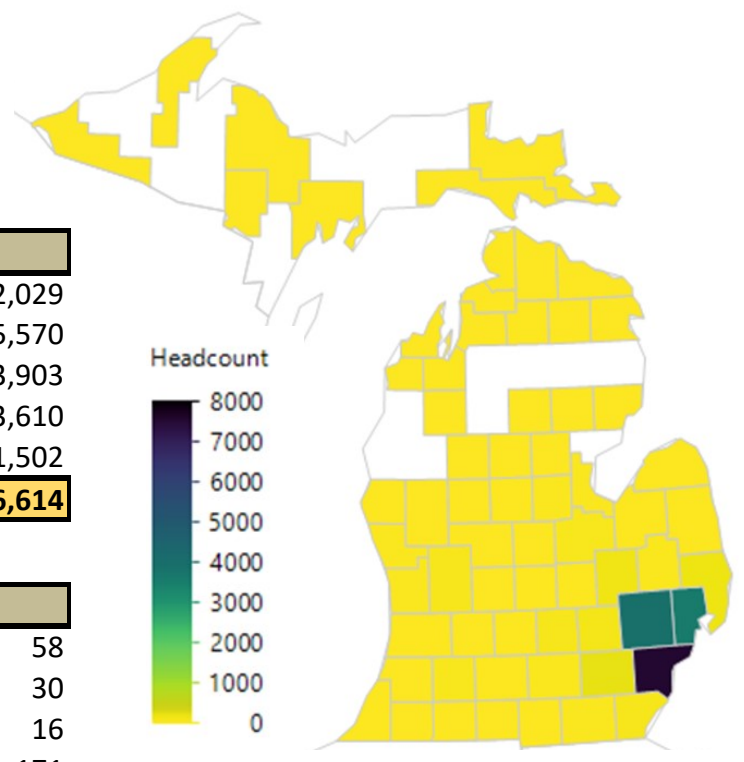
### Fall 2017 Undergraduate Enrollment by Age

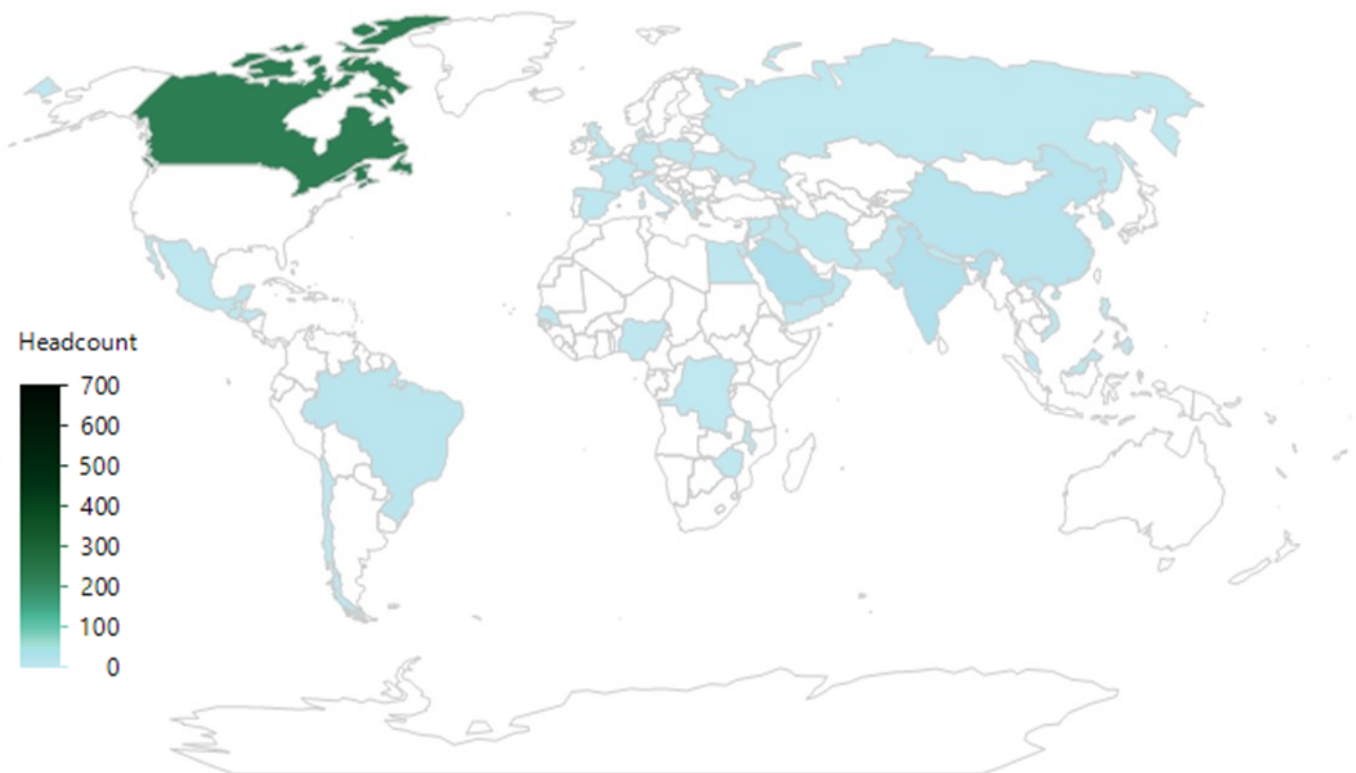

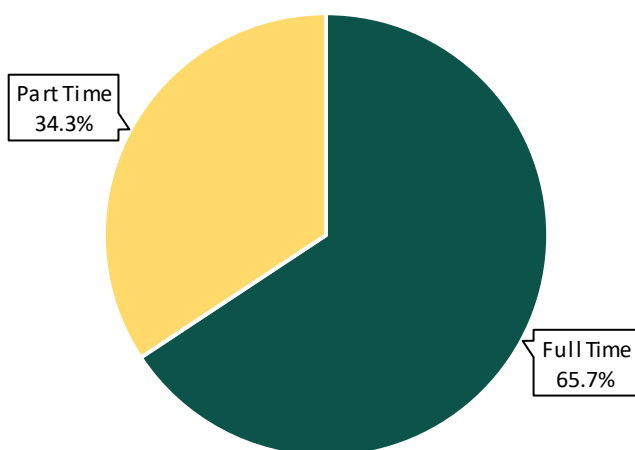

## Fall 2013 to 2017 Undergraduate Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

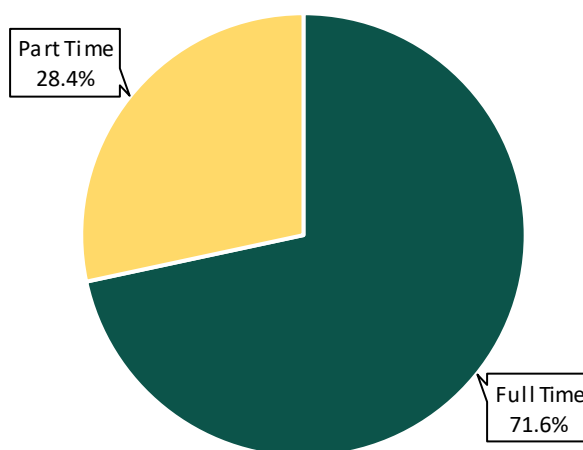

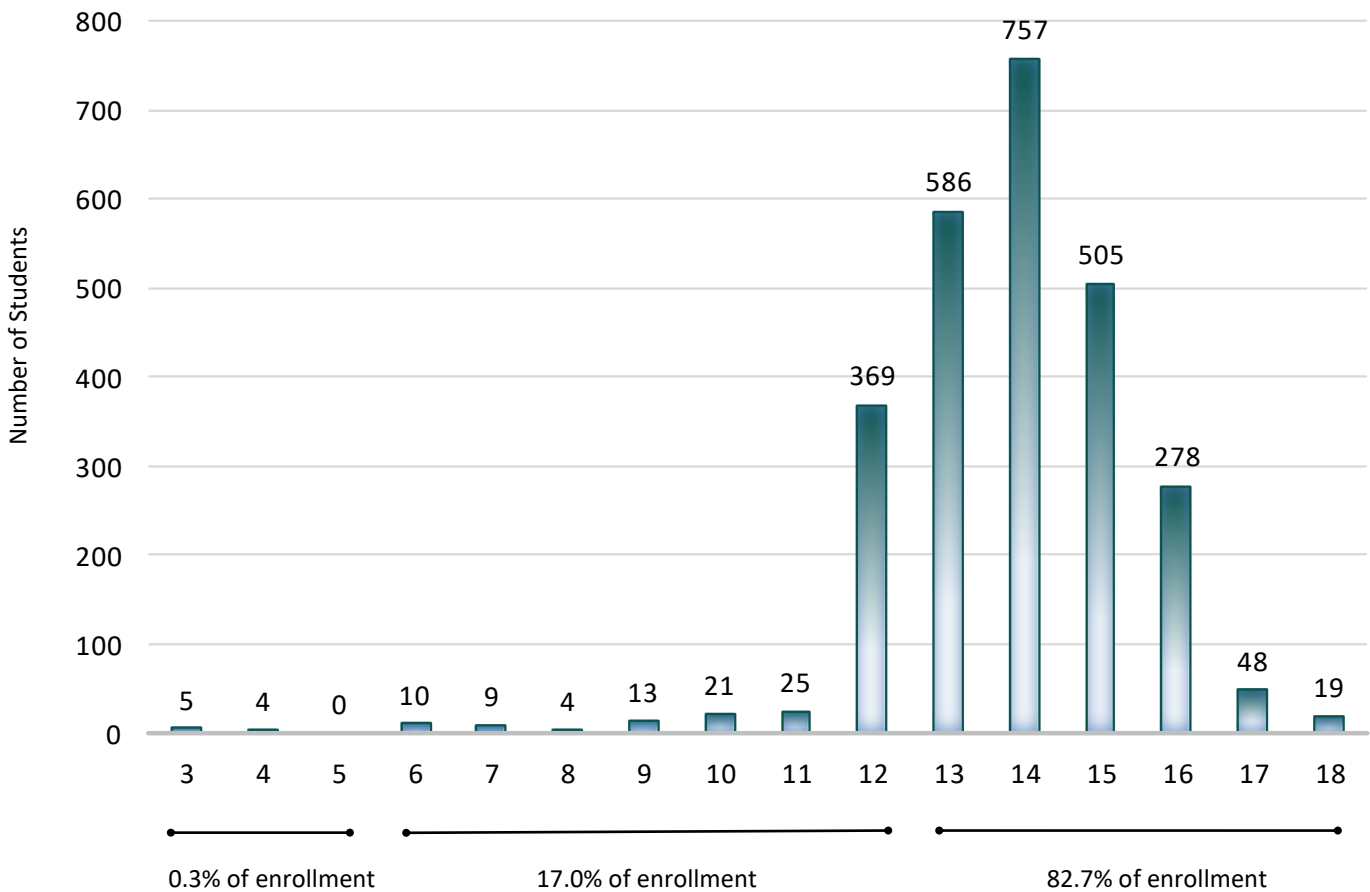

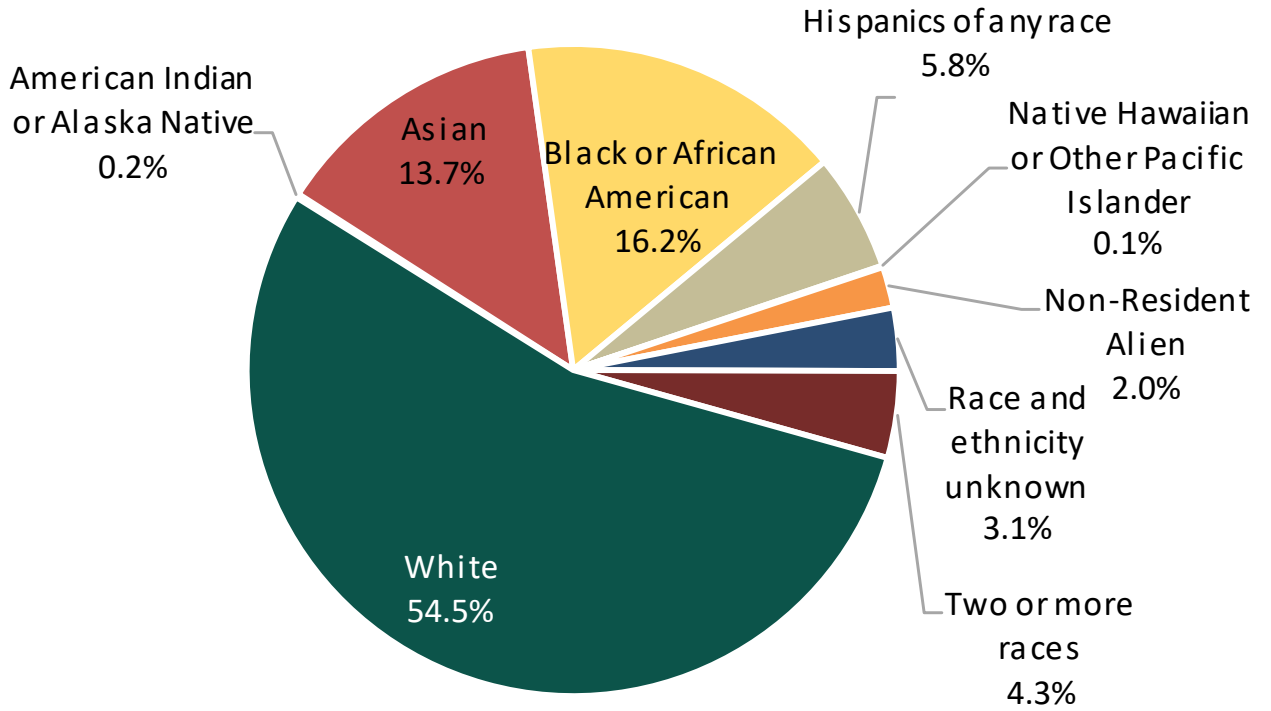
## Fall 2017 FTIAC Student Credit Hour Load Distribution



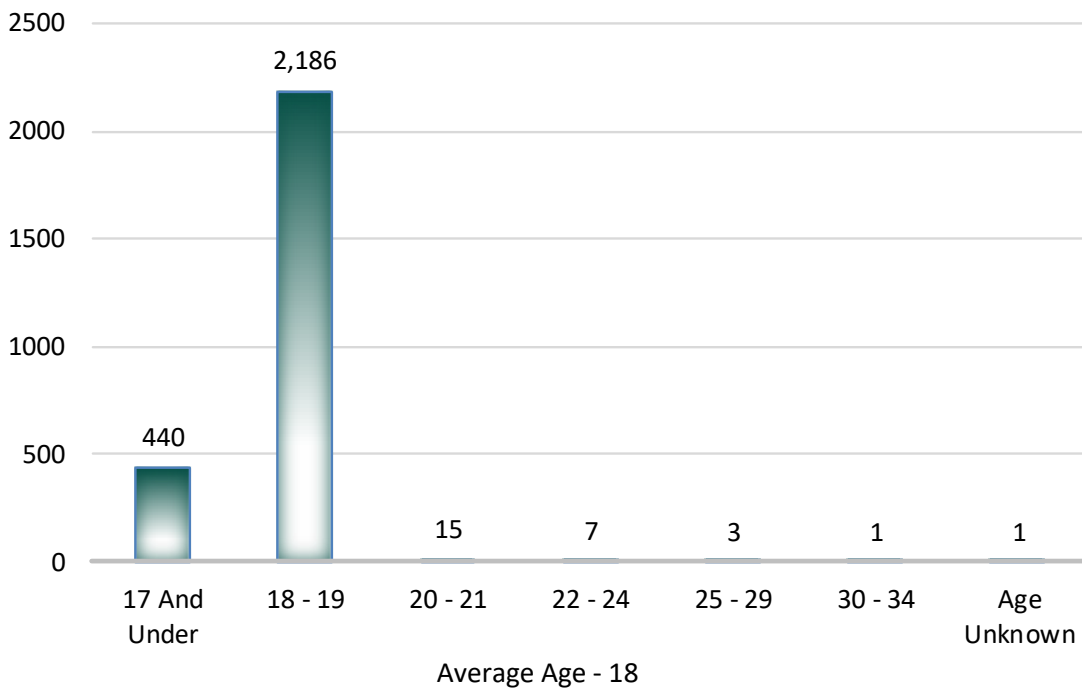

**Fall 2017 FTIAC Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity**



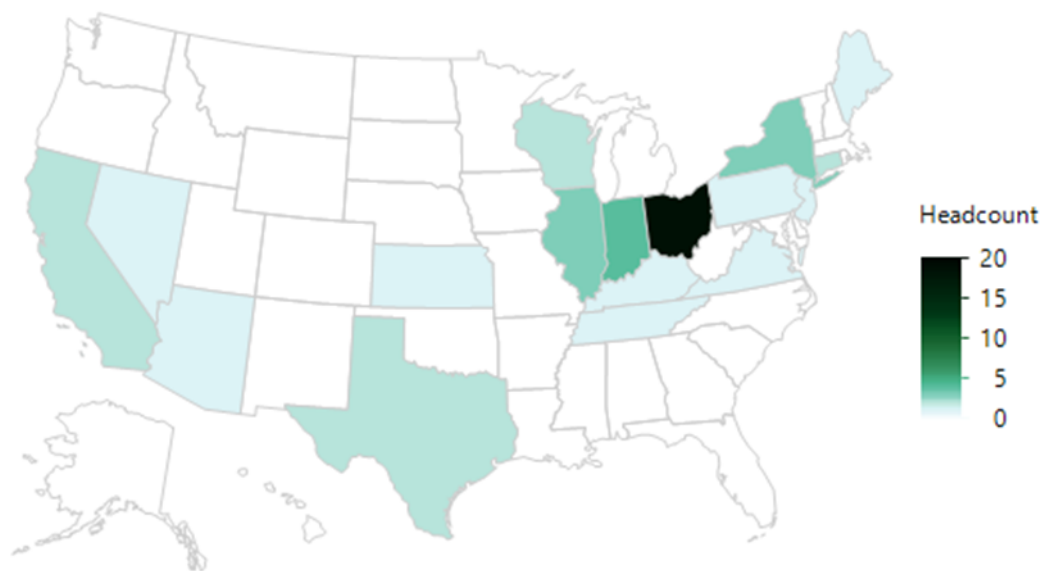
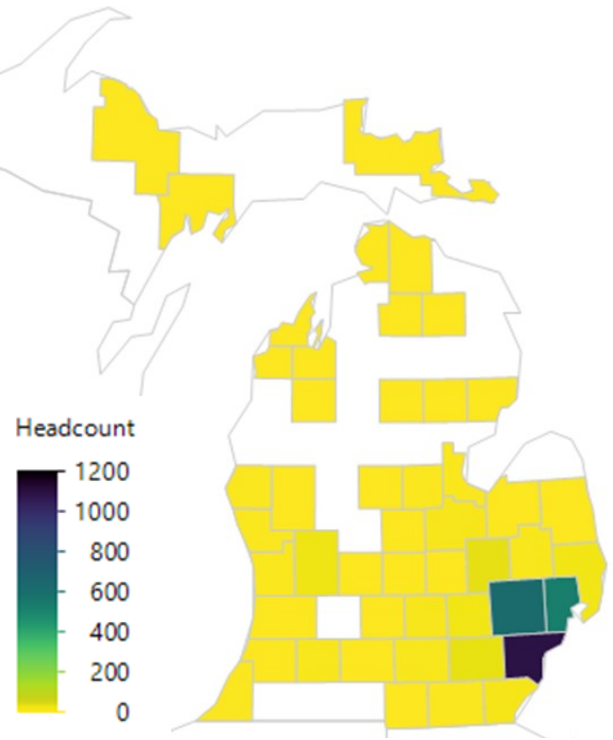
**Fall 2017 FTIAC Enrollment by Age**

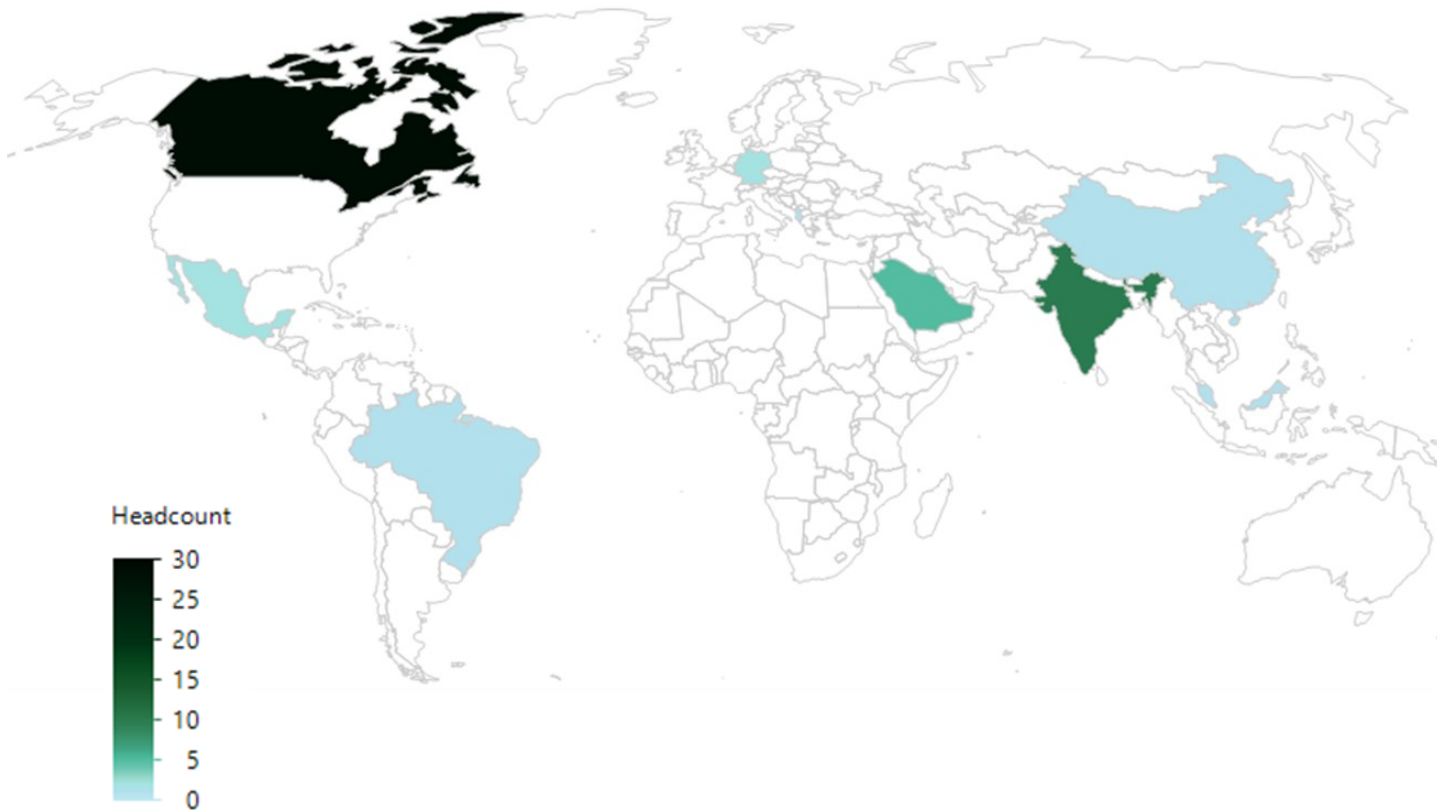

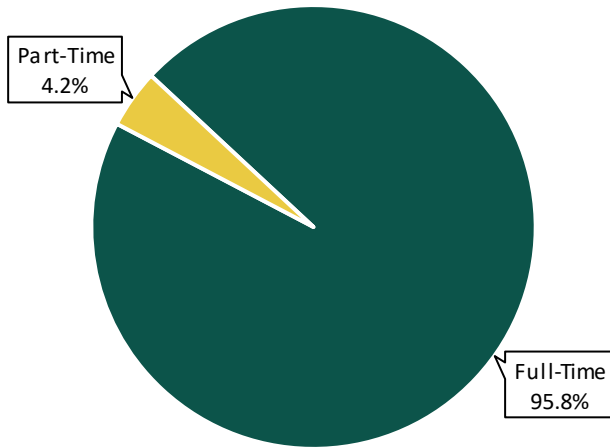

## Fall 2013 to Fall 2017 FTIAC Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

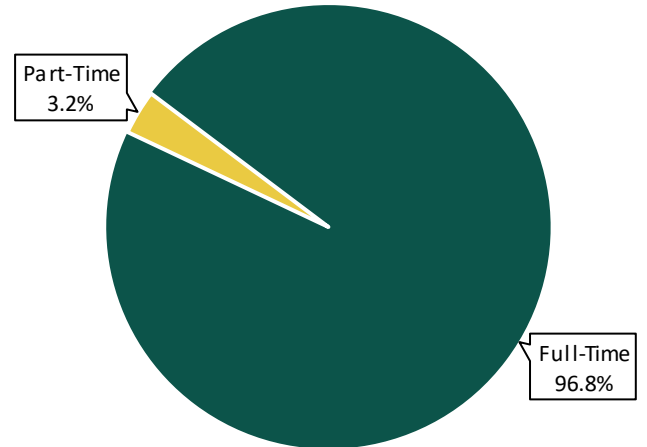

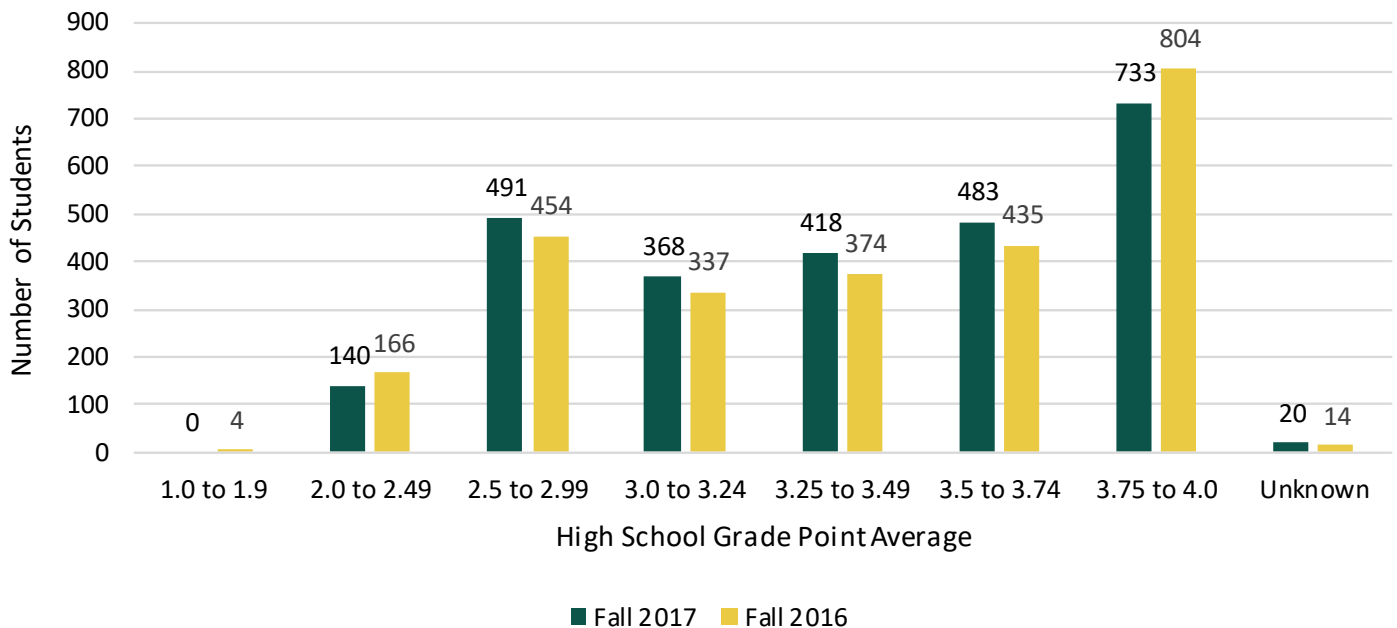

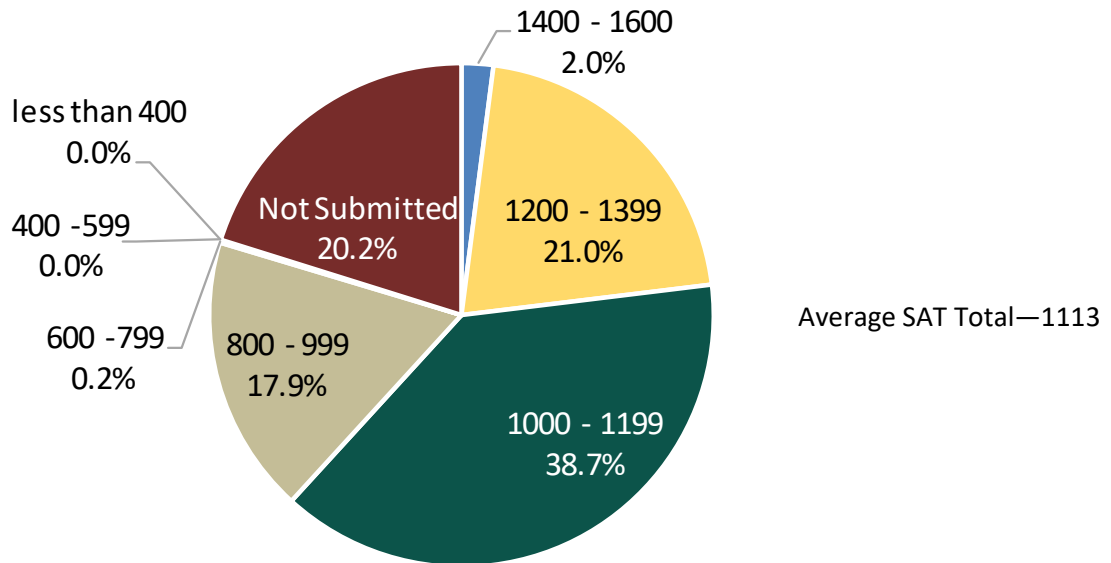


## Fall 2017 FTIAC High School Grade Point Average

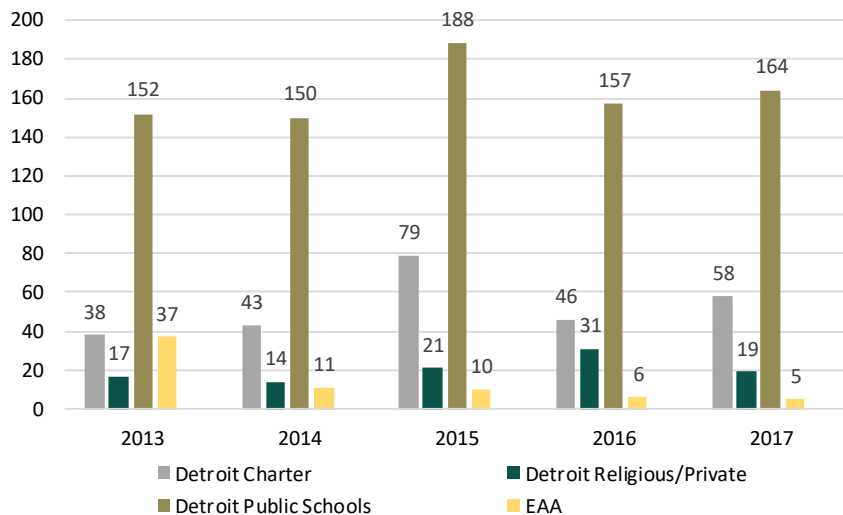

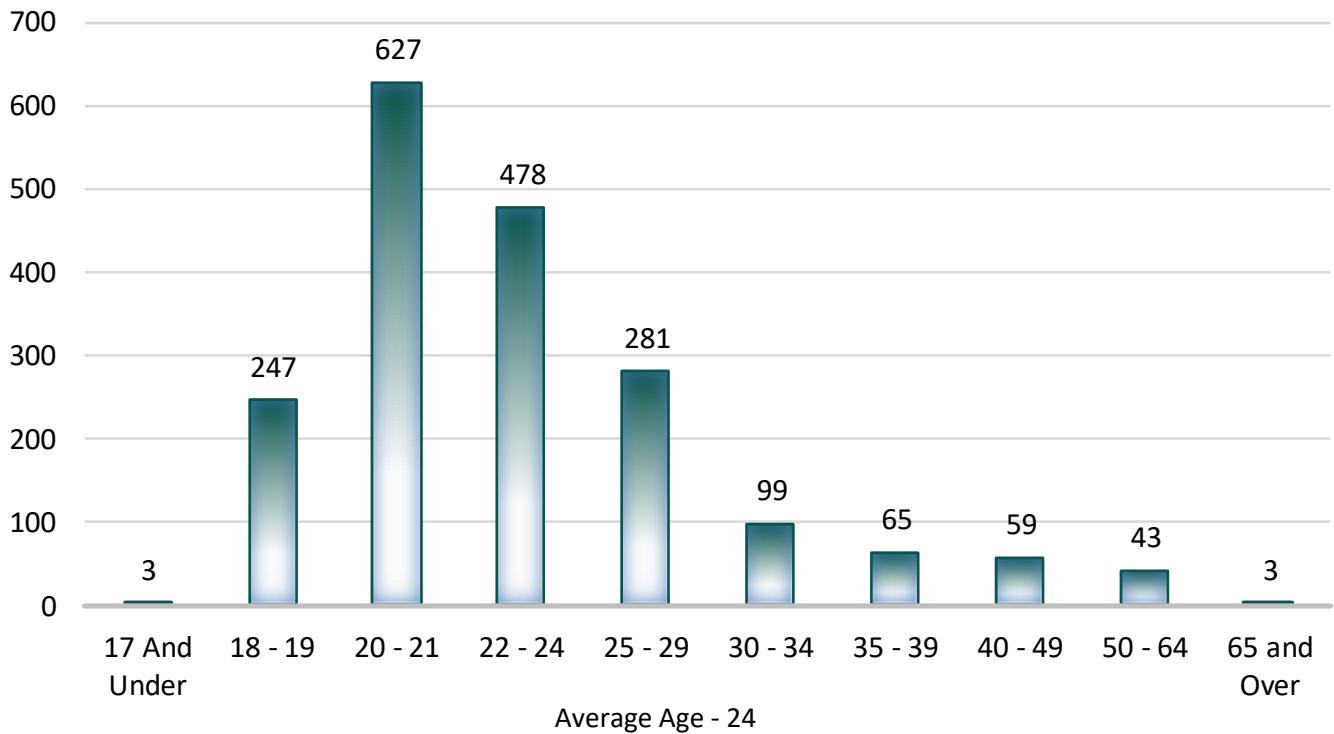

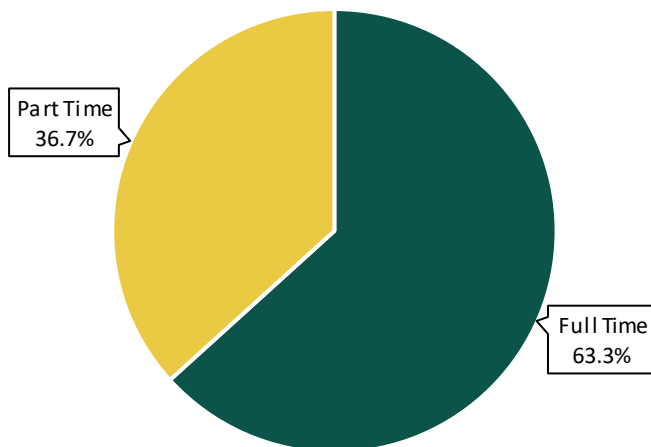
### Fall 2017 Transfer Enrollment by Age

## Fall 2017 Transfer Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



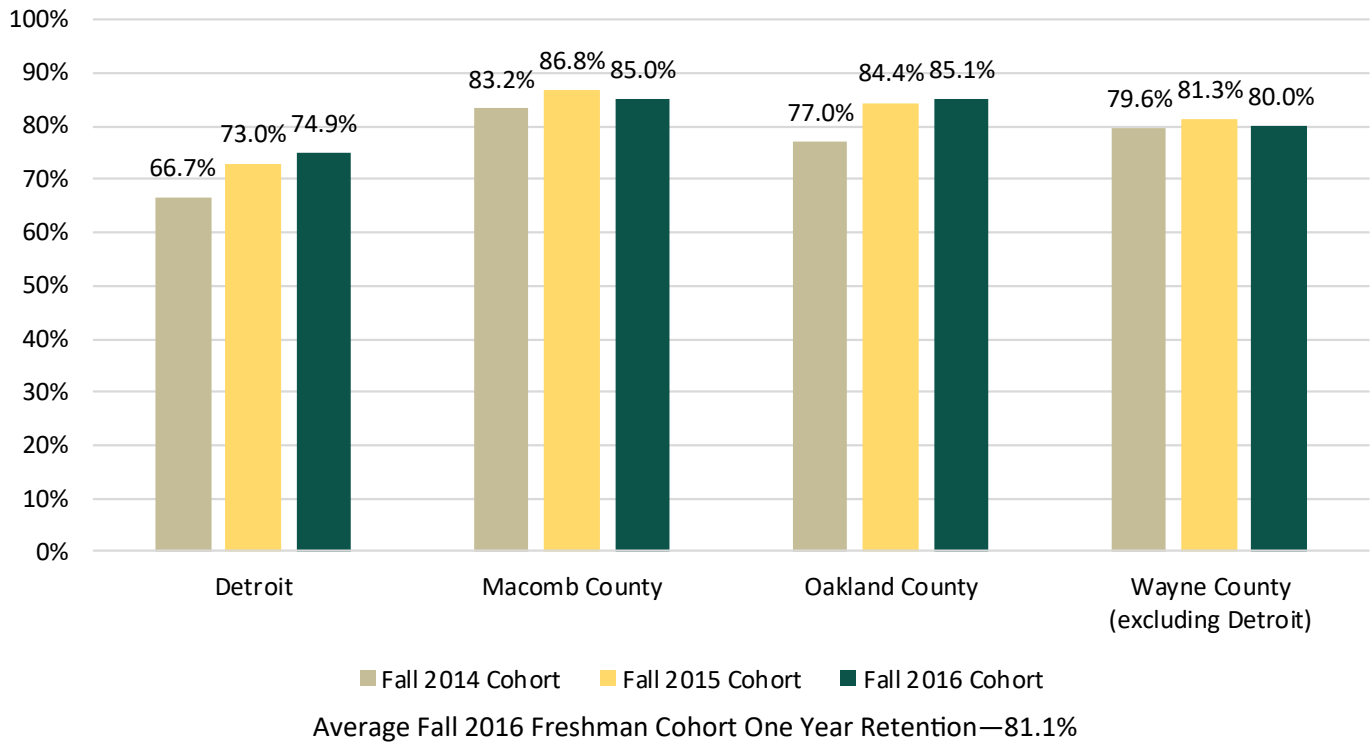

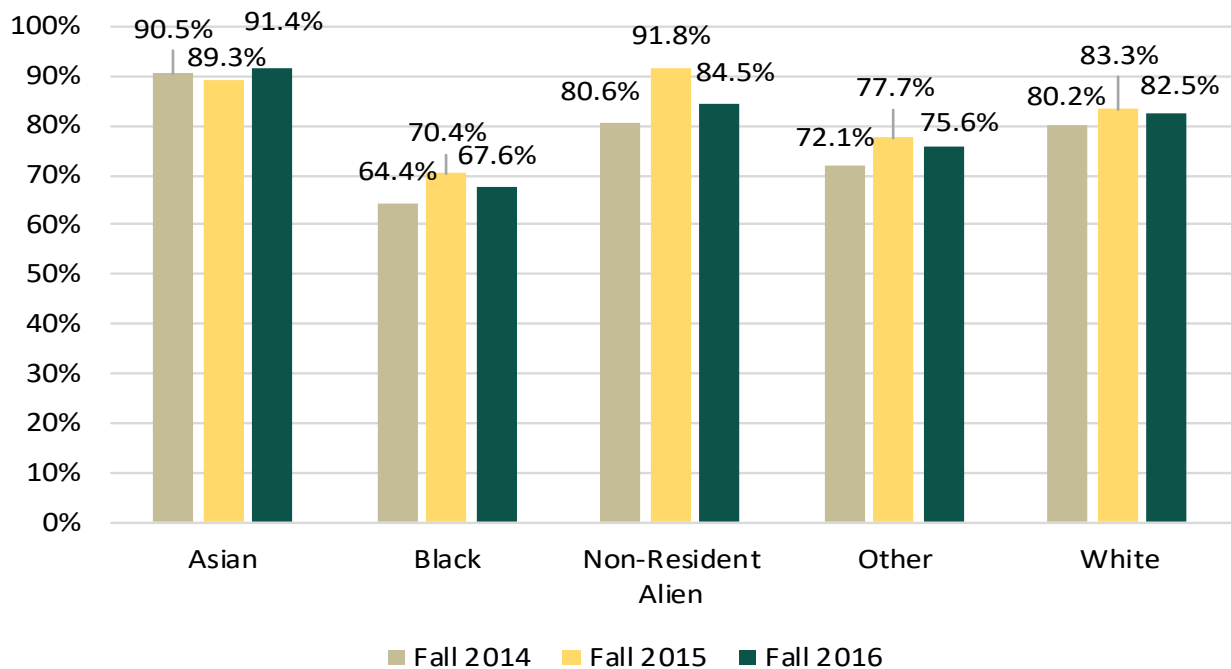

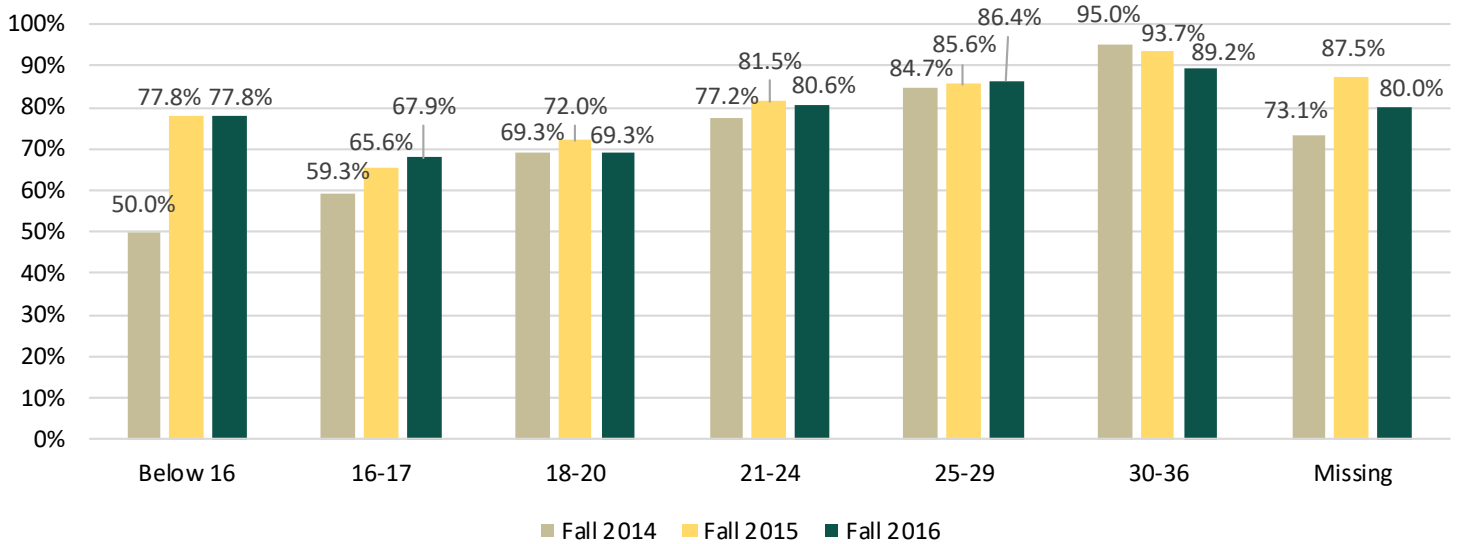
## Tri-County Fall Full-Time Freshman One Year Retention

## Fall Full-Time Freshman One Year Retention by ACT Composite Score



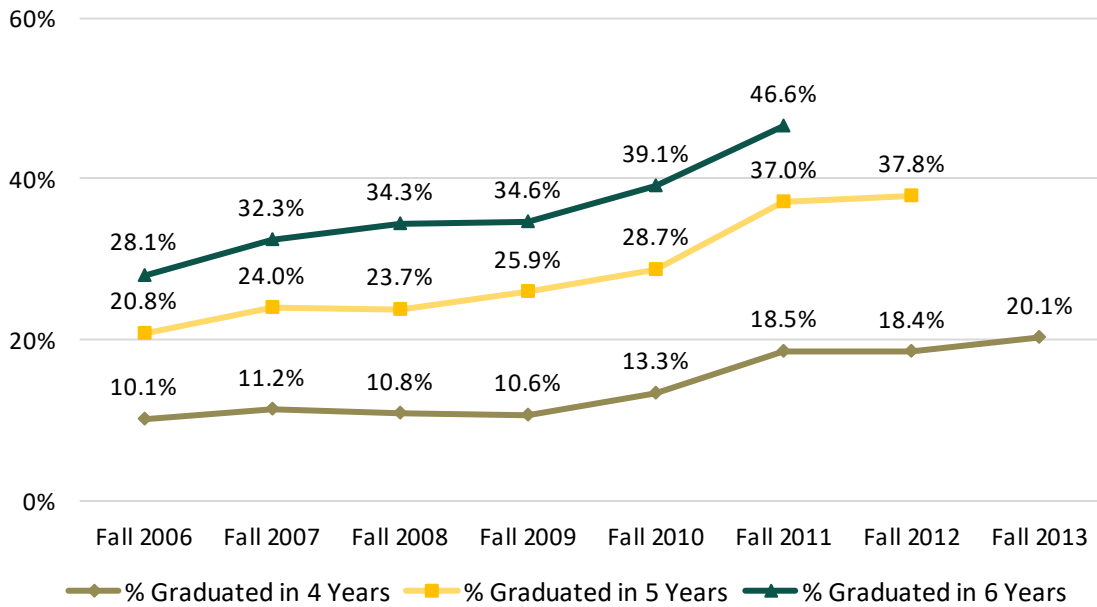

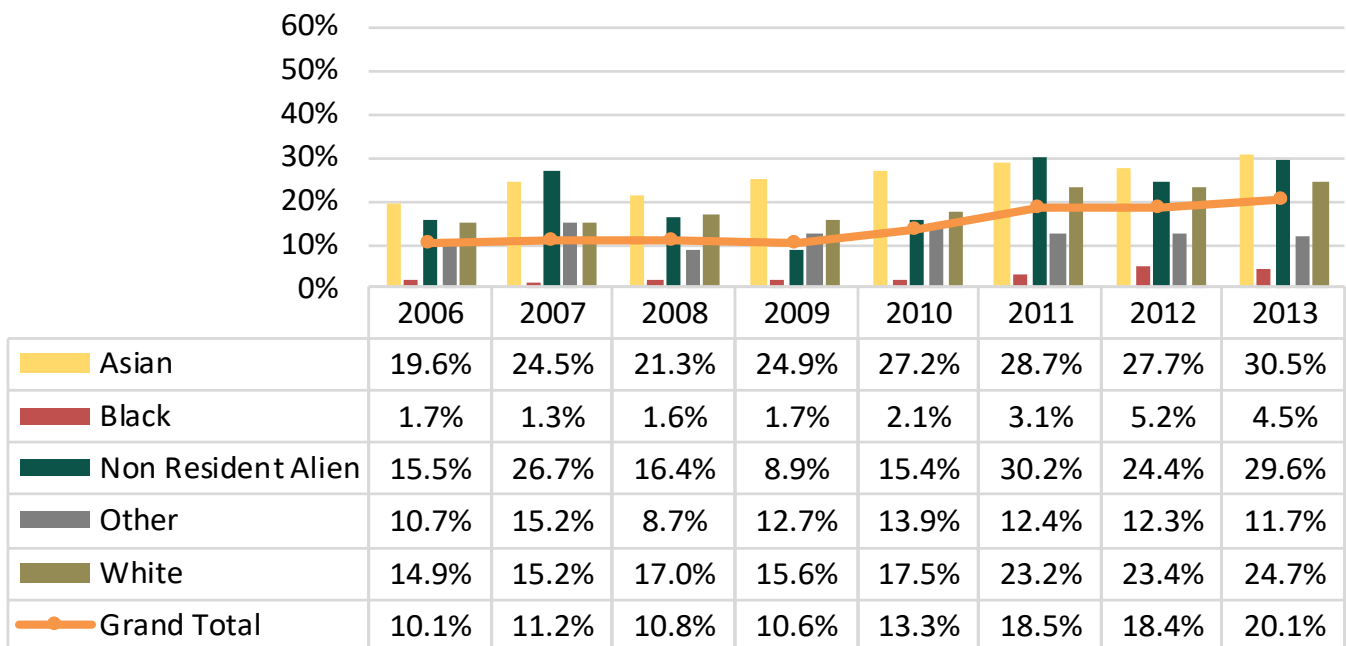

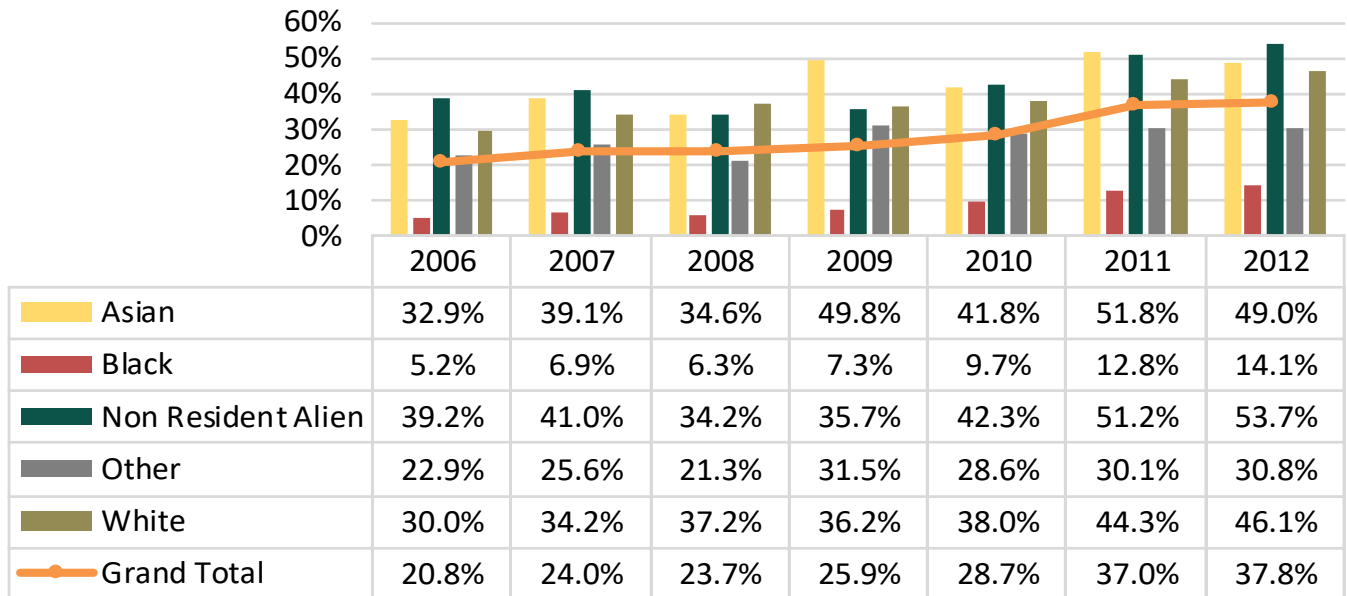
## Fall Full-Time Freshman Multi-Year Graduation Rates



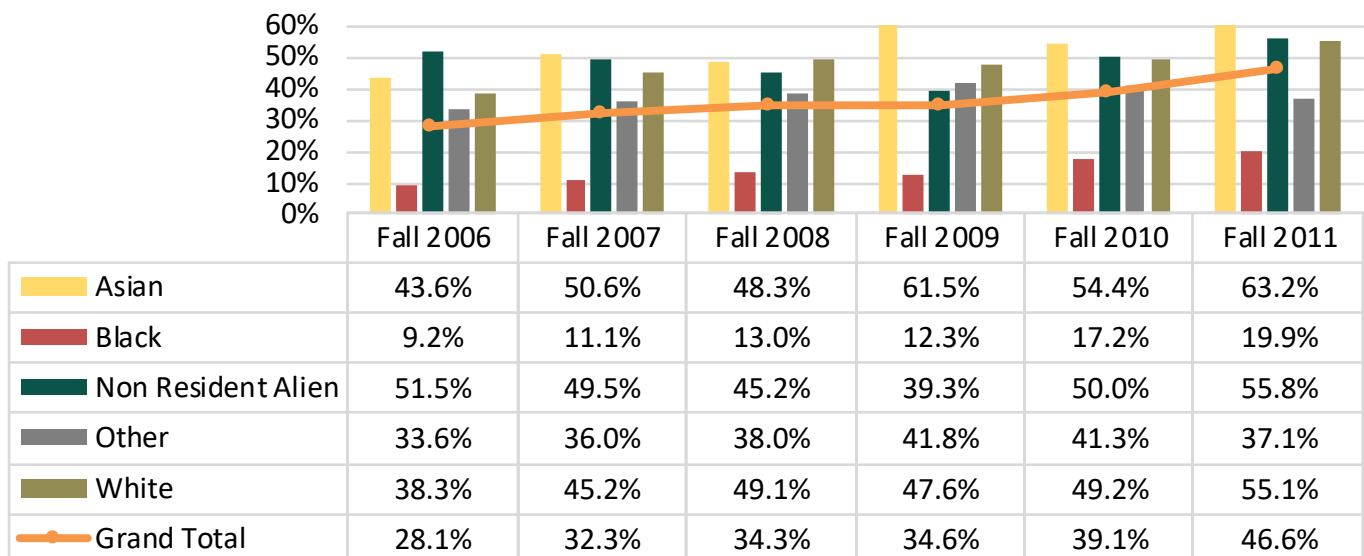
## Fall Full-Time Freshman Four-Year Graduation Rates by Race and Ethnicity

## Fall Full-Time Freshman Six-Year Graduation Rates by Race and Ethnicity



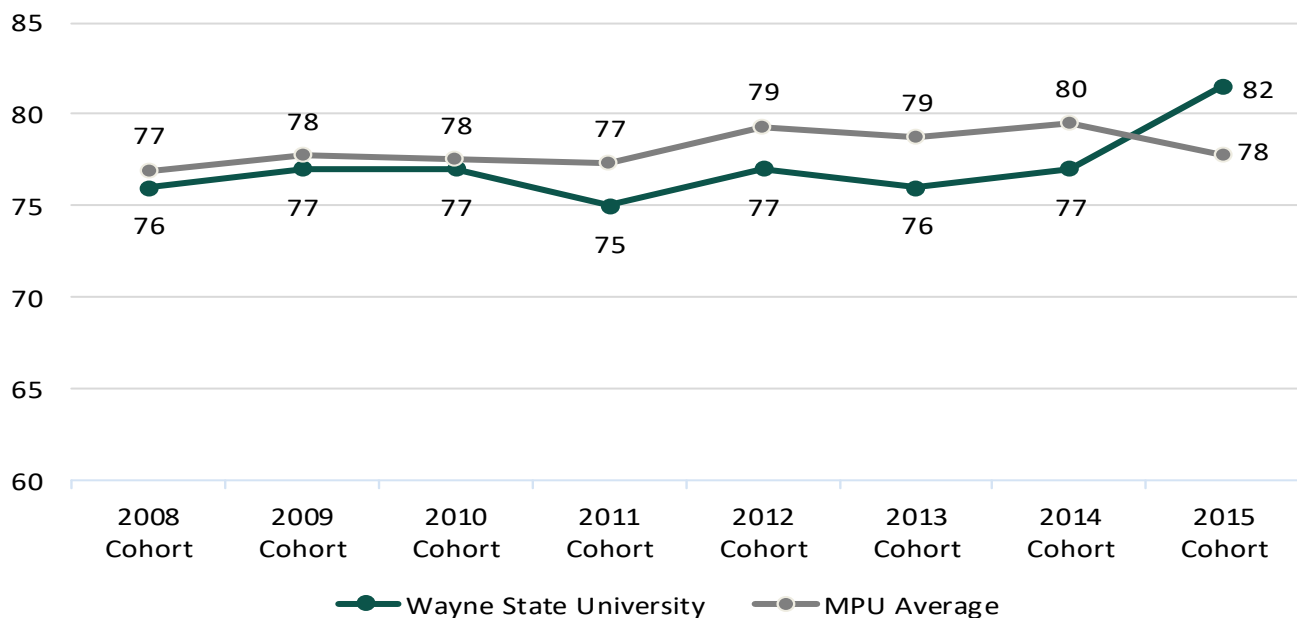

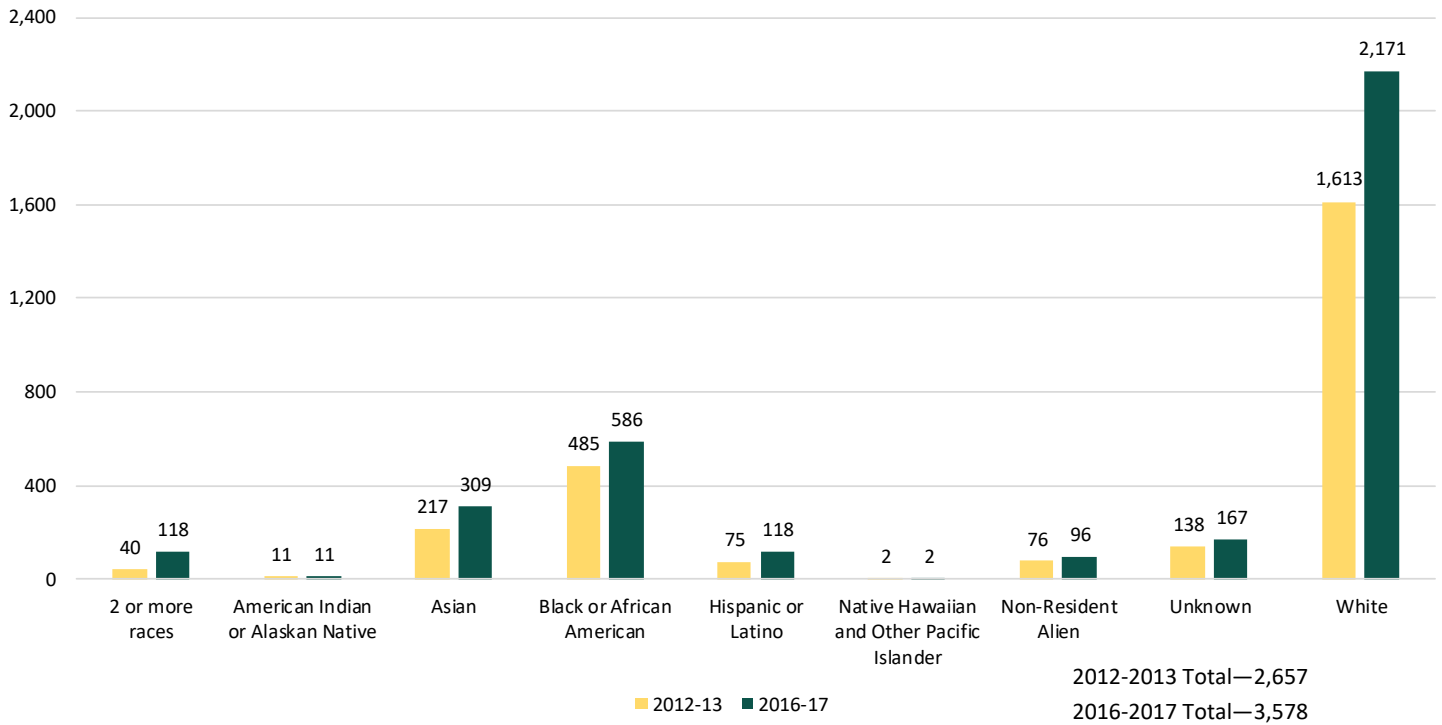

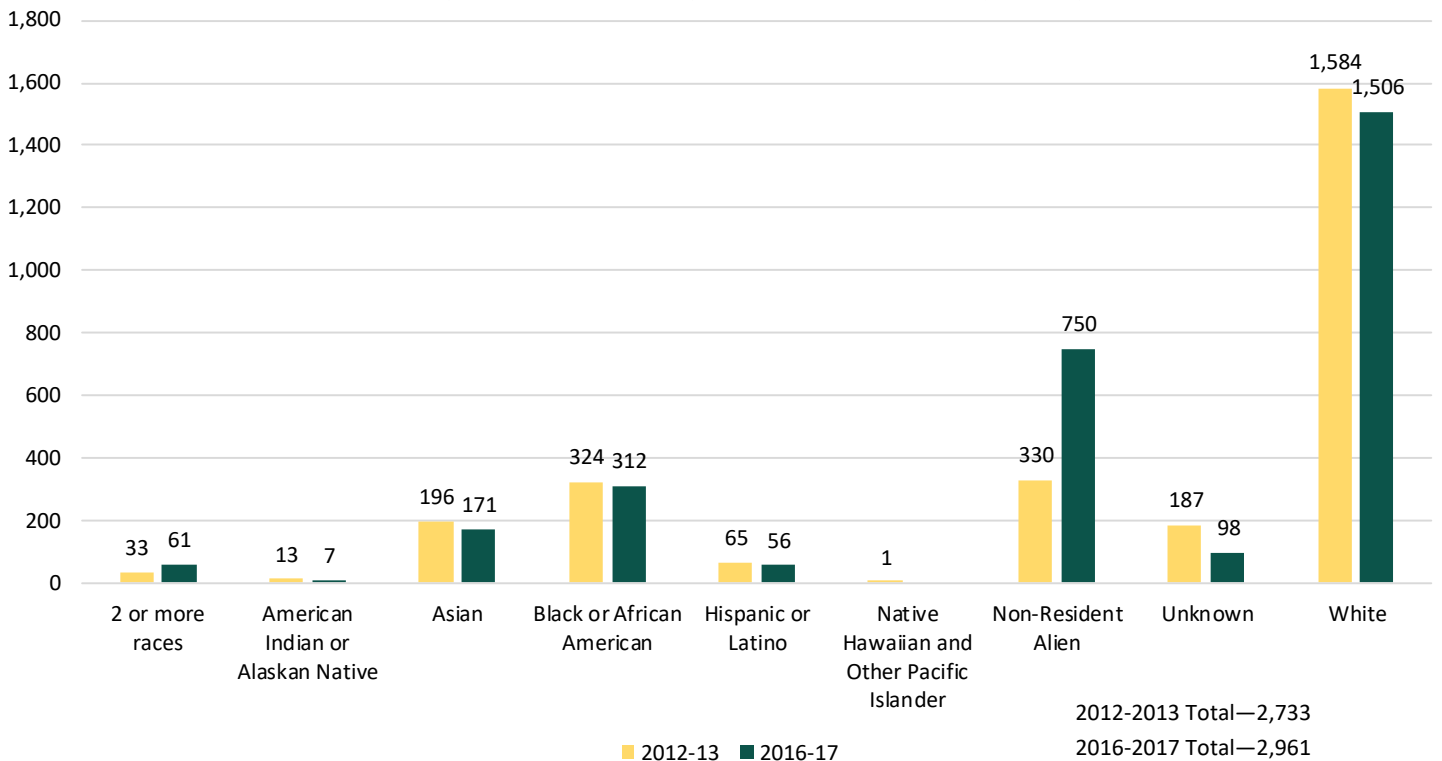

### Fall 2017 Graduate Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity



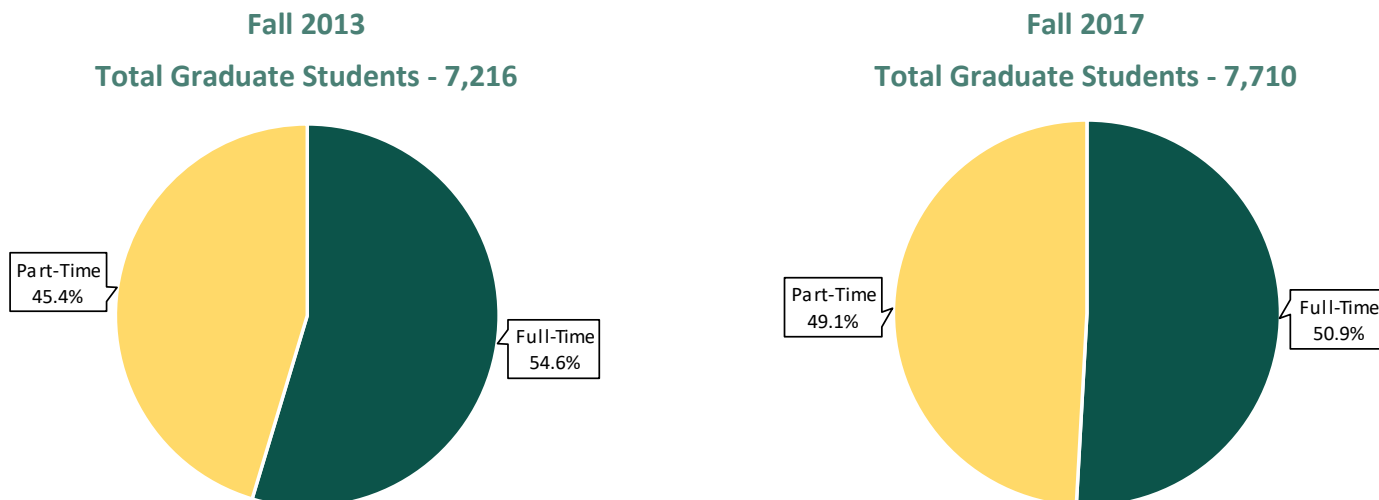
### Fall 2017 Graduate Enrollment by Age

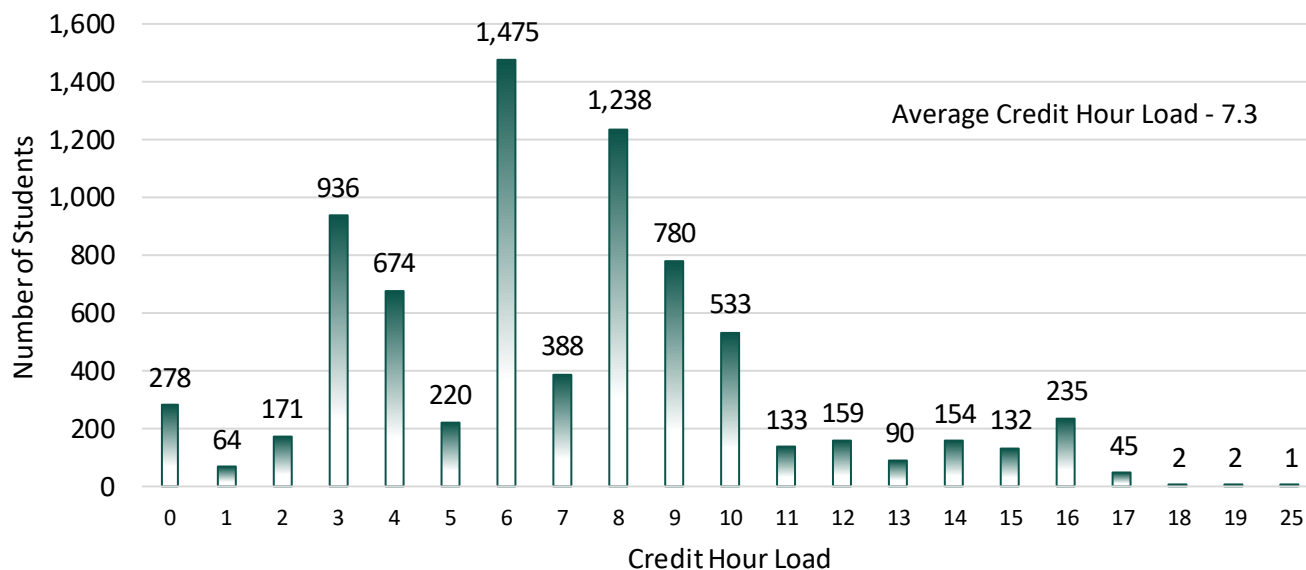
### Fall 2013 to Fall 2017 Graduate Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

### Fall 2017 Graduate Student Credit Hour Load Distribution\*

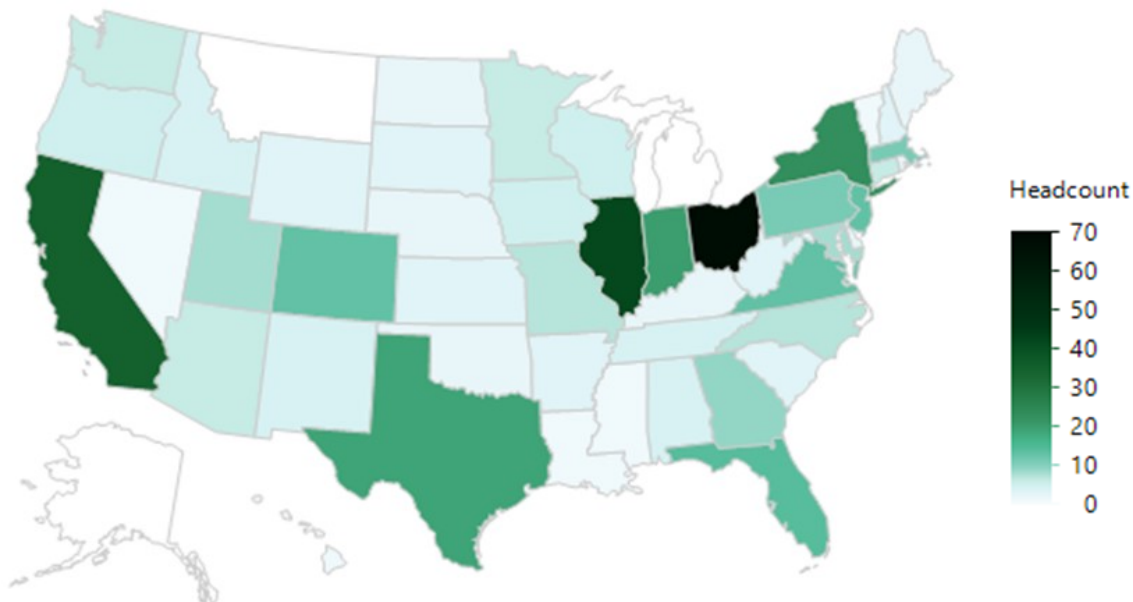
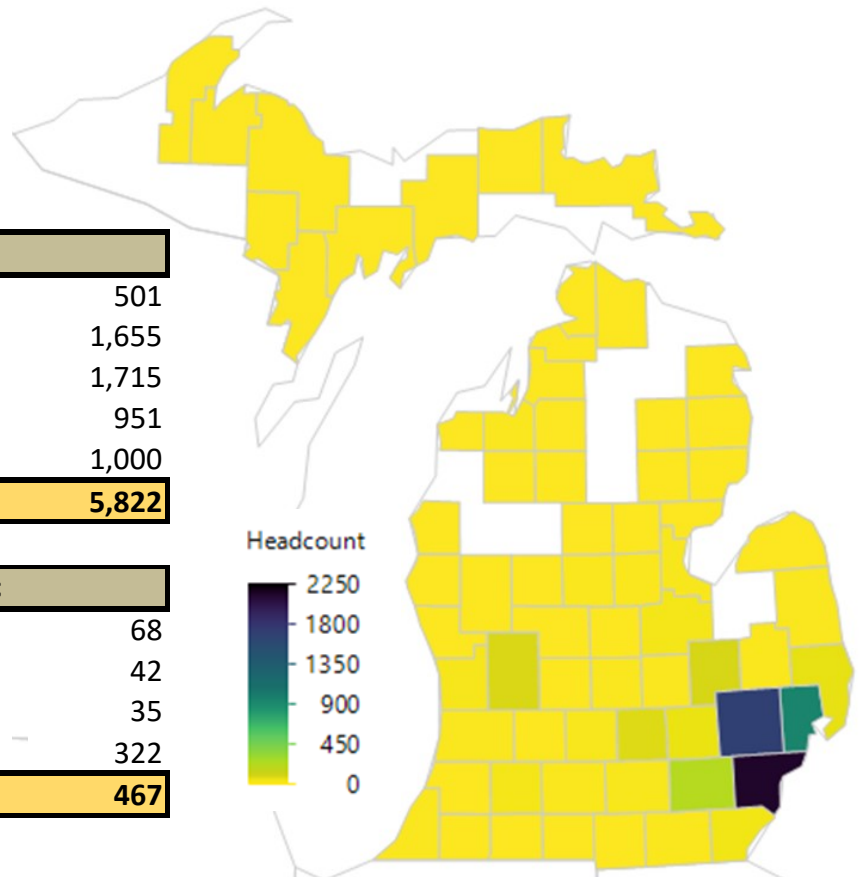

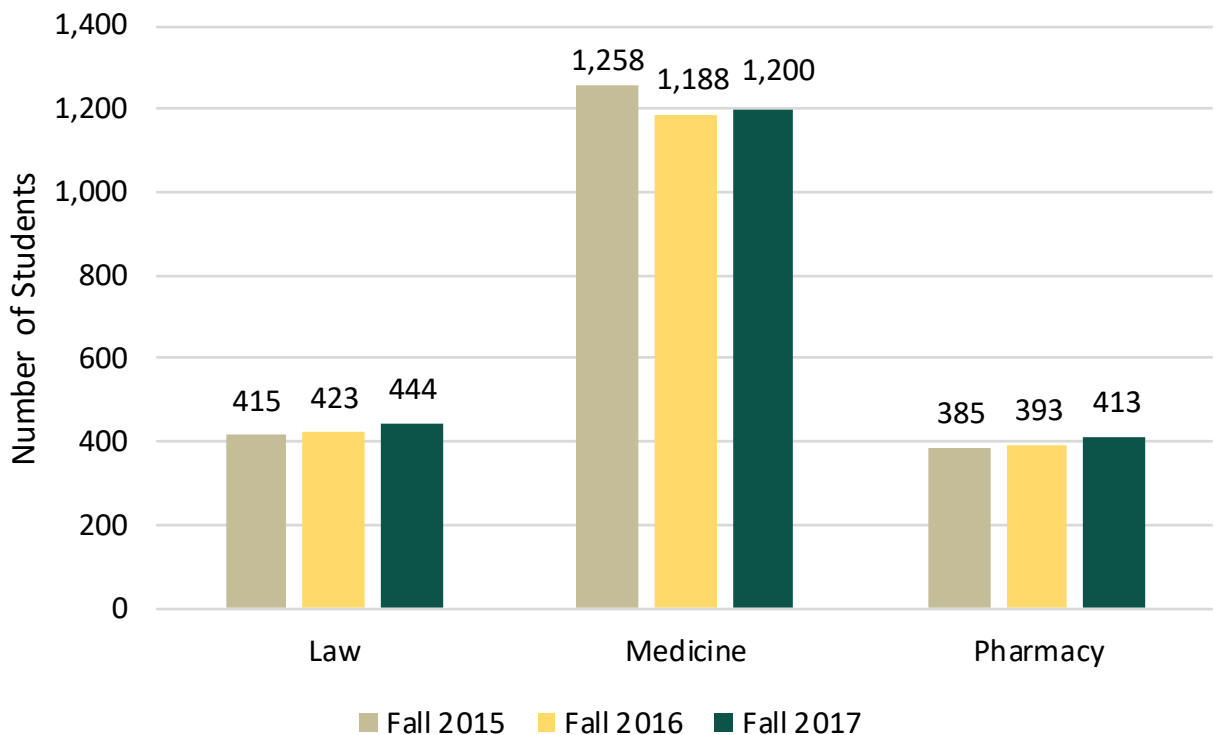

### Fall 2015 to Fall 2017 Professional Student Headcount Comparison

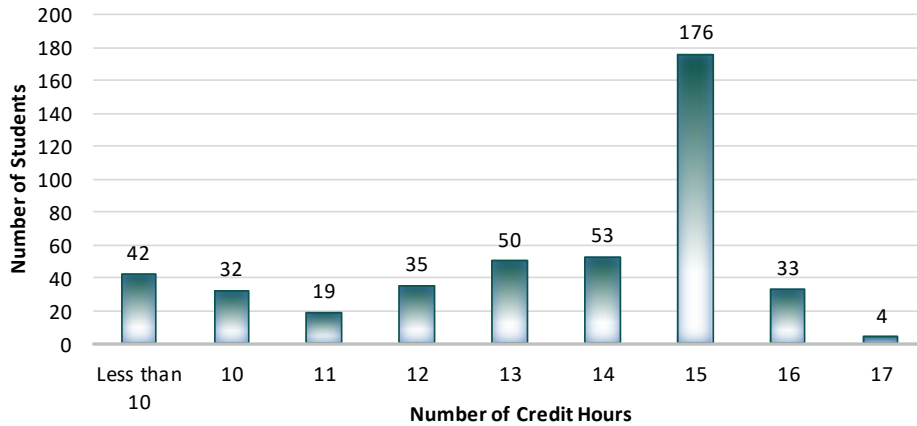

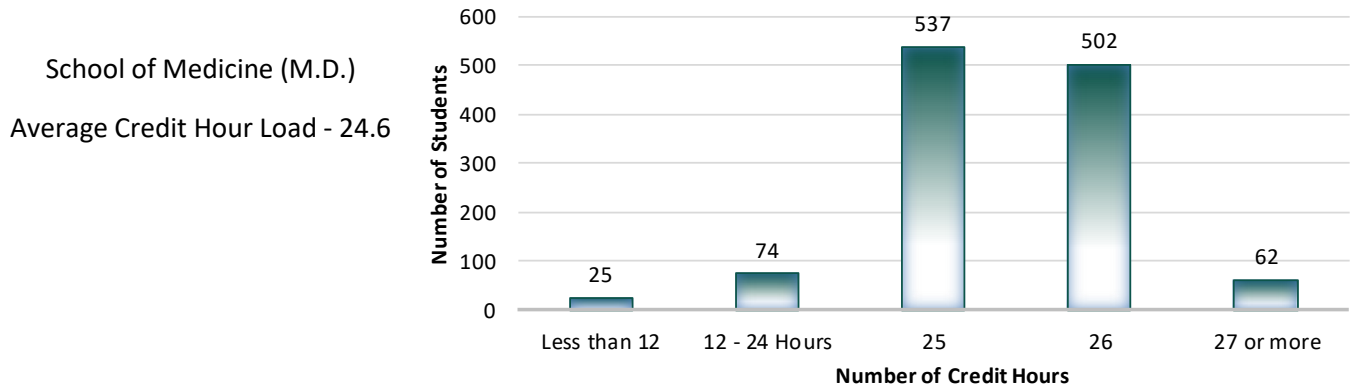

### Fall 2017 Law Student Credit Hour Load Average



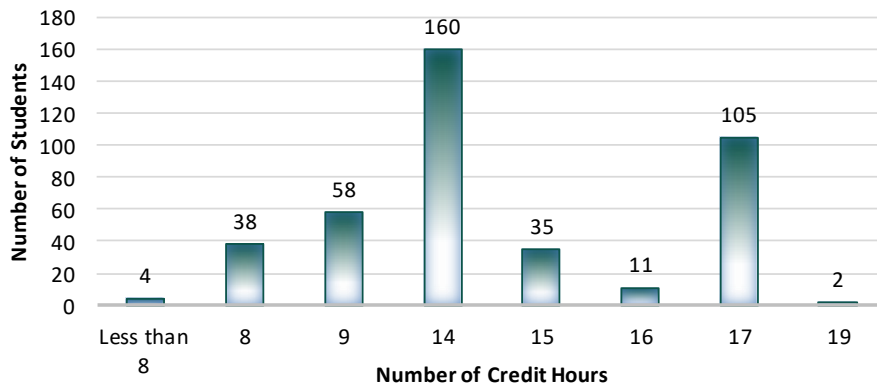

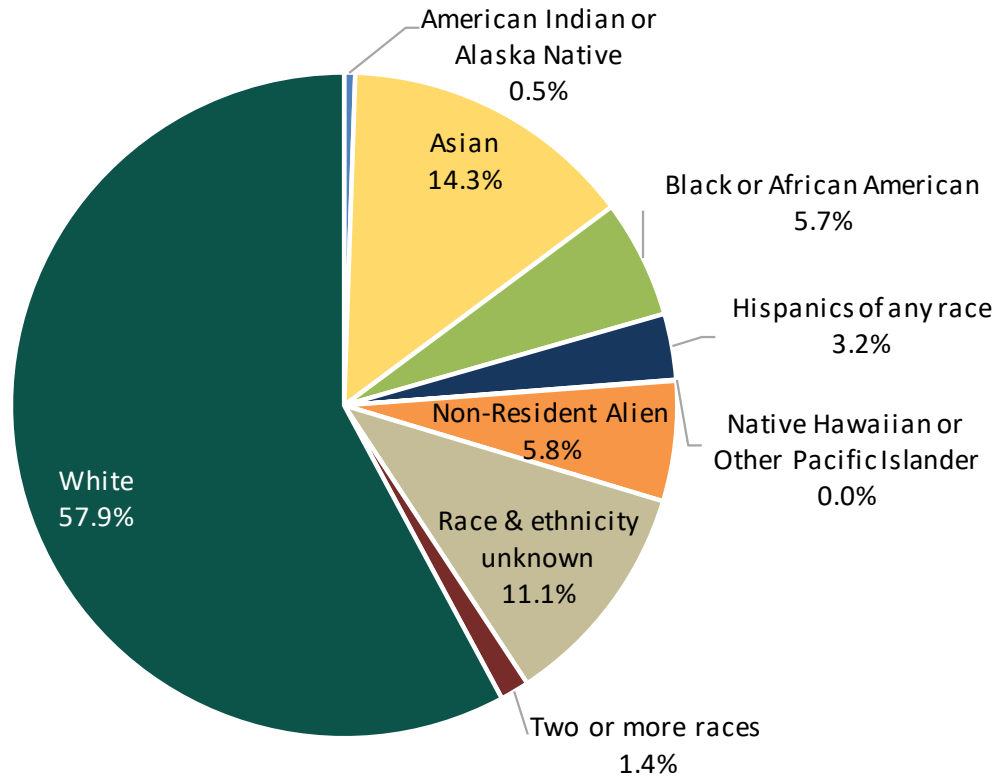

### Fall 2017 PharmD Student Credit Hour Load Average

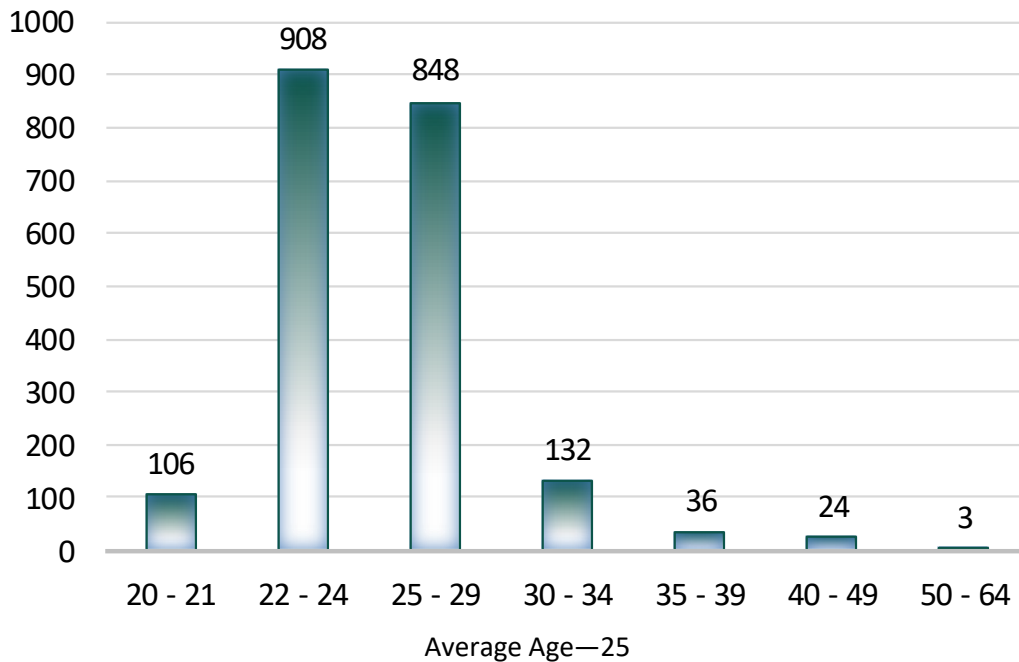

### Fall 2017 Professional Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity



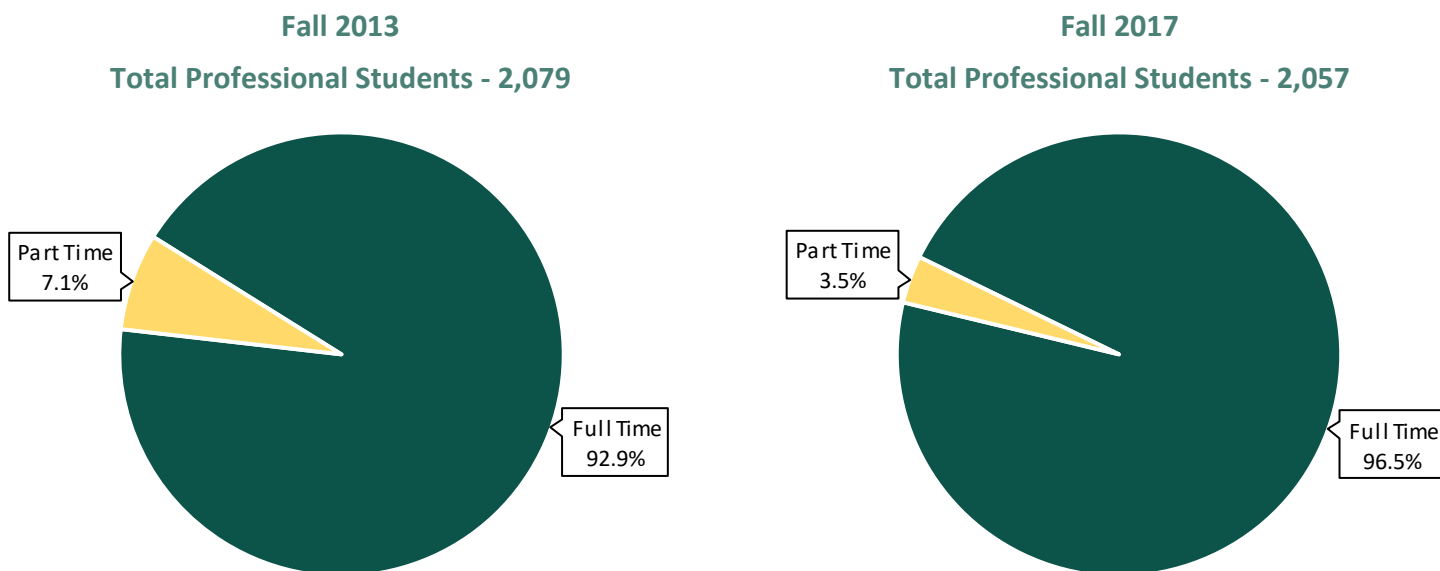

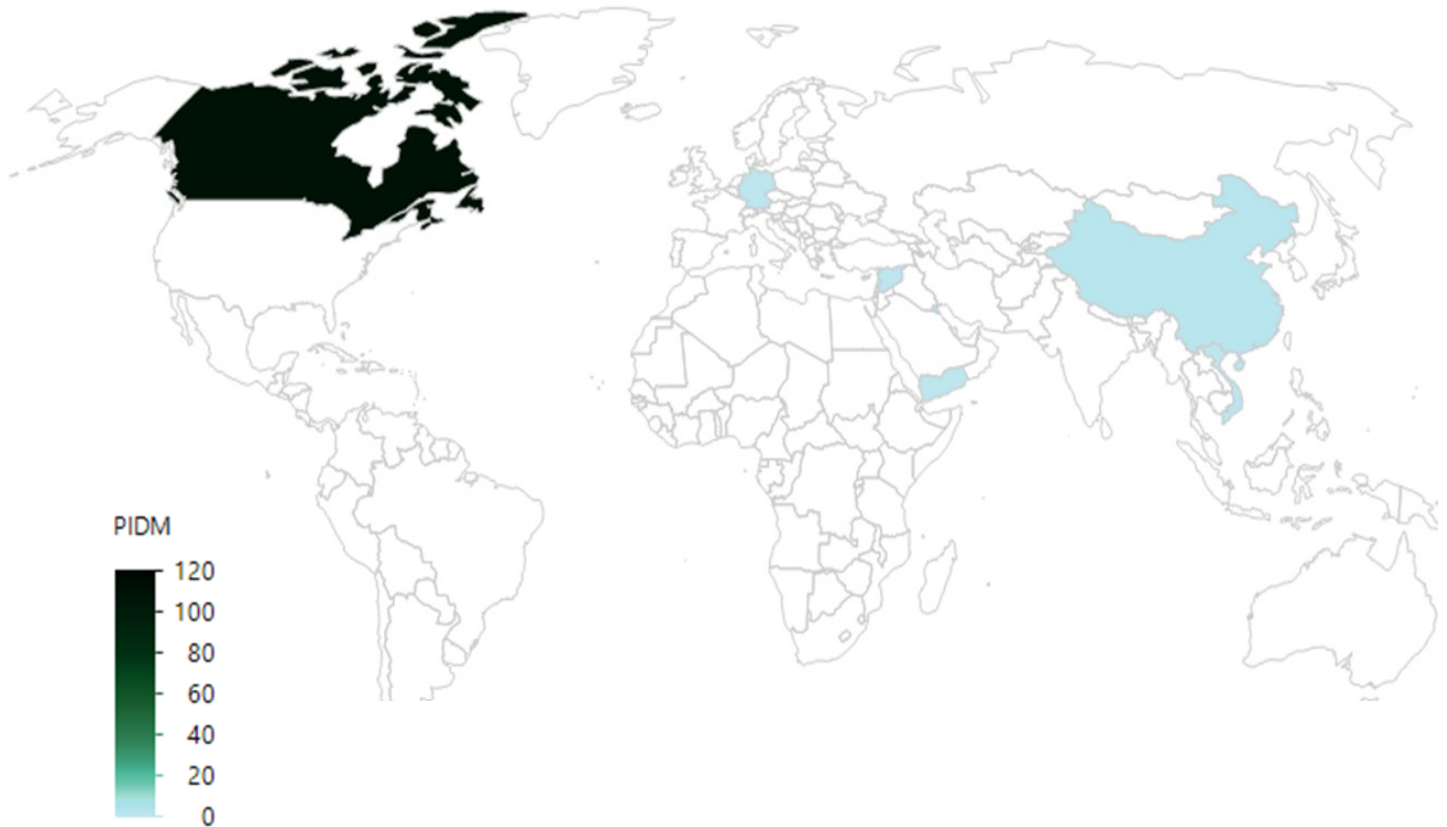

**Credit Hour**—A credit hour is defined as one class hour per week or its equivalent.

**FTIAC (or First-time Freshman)** - (See IPEDS definition) “An entering freshman who has never attended any college. Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended for the first time in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).”

**Full Time Student (Fall/Winter Semester)** - A student at the following level must be enrolled in the following amount of credit hours per term, regardless of the level of the course: Undergraduate, 12 or more credit hours; Graduate, 8 or more credit hours; Professional (excluding Medical students), 10 or more credit hours.

**Graduate Student**—A student who holds a bachelor’s or first professional degree, or equivalent, and is enrolled in a graduate program.

**Headcount (Enrollment)**—Number of students enrolled at the institution as of census date of the term, the tenth day of classes. Each student equals one headcount, regardless of the credit hours taken.

**Non-Resident Student**—A student present in Michigan for educational purposes, who has not established residency by presence in the State of Michigan, nor attendance in Michigan high schools, nor military service.

**Professional student**-- A student enrolled in either the Medical Doctor program, Doctor of Pharmacy program, or Juris Doctor program.

**Resident Student**—A student having established residence in Michigan by presence in the State of Michigan, or established attendance in Michigan high schools, or established military service.

**Retention Rates** — Retention rate is the percentage of first-time, full-time freshman in a given fall term who returned to the university in a subsequent fall term. For example, the “3rd Yr” retention rate for fall 2015 first-time, full-time freshman is the percentage of fall 2015 first-time, full-time freshman who returned for fall 2017. The calculation of retention rate does not include students who returned to the university after having graduated from the same university.

Reminder: As is the convention with IPEDS, data used for these calculations may be adjusted for students who departed for the following reasons: deceased, permanently disabled, or joined the armed forces (including those called to active duty from the Reserves or National Guard) or foreign aid service of the federal government of or official church missions. These are allowable exclusions, and may be subtracted from the cohort prior to calculating graduation rate.

**Timing Definition**— The definition of “a year” is the 12-month period from the beginning of a fall term in one year to the beginning of the following fall term. The fall enrollment status is based on the official reporting date for the IPEDS fall enrollment report.

**Transfer Student**—A student entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level. Excludes FTIACs who attended postsecondary institutions in the prior summer term.

**Undergraduate student**—A student enrolled in a bachelor’s degree program or post-bachelor certificate program; includes non-degree-seeking students who do not have a bachelor’s degree.



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
